As a teacher I often brought my classes to the school library to conduct research or just to sign out a book. As a parent I brought my children to the local library to take part in activities and to borrow books. As a citizen I use the library frequently and encourage my neighbors and friends to visit their local library to learn, first hand, all the benefits of library membership. While living in Brookfield, CT helping to care for four grandchildren I was asked to join the New Library Committee. This was an ad-hoc group of concerned citizens tasked with developing plans for a new and larger town library. We spent two years meeting with architects, town planners, developers, and library directors and staff in libraries that had been expanded or built new. We presented our case to the town Board of Selectmen who put the cost of the new library (\$20,000,000) to the town as a referendum. Unfortunately the referendum didn't pass. Despite the loss, my belief in the value of libraries remains unabated. Libraries are more than just book loaners. They are and should be the hub of a community. Now libraries offer more services and benefits to local communities than ever before. Libraries can and should always be evolving culturally, socially, and technologically. Libraries can and should always be growing to accommodate the needs of the surrounding community and neighborhood.
