


- Comprehensive plans updated every 8-10 years



PLANPinellas FOCUS

- Establish Growth Framework

DOES

- Provide flexibility for affordable housing density
- Add additional Future Land Use category (PRD)
- Call for creation of Sustainability and Resiliency Acton Plan to further direct policy/regulatory changes
- Expand economic development focus to include adaptive reuse, more small business support and workforce training

DOES NOT

- Increase density / intensity for Future Land Use categories (AC/MU consistent with Countywide Plan)
- Change existing land use
- Change densities in Coastal High Hazard Area (CHHA)



- Requested Action
 - Authorize the Housing and Community Development Department to transmit the proposed Ordinance updating and replacing the Comprehensive Plan to the State Department of Economic Opportunity.



- Adoption Schedule
 - ✓ Nov 8, 2021 DRC: review/recommendation
 - ✓ Dec 9, 2021 LPA: public hearing
 - □ Jan 25, 2022 BCC: 'transmittal' public hearing
 - □ Jan/Feb 2022 Transmittal to and review by State Agencies
 - □ Apr 2022 /May 2022 BCC: 'adoption' public hearing


