DBA Directions for Living	Telehealth Remote Access to Crisis Evaluation (TRACE)	\$40,000.00	Crisis Counselors for TRACE is a behavioral health program developed by DFL that provides virtual crisis intervention to divert persons from entering the wrong system (i.e., jail, crisis stabilization units) and works with police departments.
MORE Health, Inc.	Firearm Safety and Violence Prevention Project	\$15,000.00	Funding to provide Firearm Safety Education Lessons to children, teens, their families, and their teachers. All of Pinellas County's public third-grade classes are offered this safety lesson.
Pinellas County Sheriff's Office	Sexual Predator and Offender Tracking (SPOT) Unit Deputy	\$60,000.00	Funding to maintain SPOT unit including salary for SPOT deputy to register, monitor, track, apprehend and provide community updates on sexual predators.
Suncoast Center, Inc.	Forensic Focused Outreach Services	\$40,000.00	Funding to provide psychiatric evaluations, mental health and substance abuse symptom management; treatment planning, screenings, counseling, therapy, and case management to clients.

WestCare	Mustard Seed Inn Case Management	\$35,000.00	Funding to support a Recovery Support Specialist/Case Manager to assist adults with substance abuse and/or co-occurring mental health disorders to stay substance free, learn how to cope with crisis, learn how to stay safe, obtain employment, and connect them to other services as needed.
