American Rescue Plan Overview



What is the American Rescue Plan?

• Legislation signed by President on March 11, 2021 - provides \$1.9 trillion in spending to assist in pandemic recovery and create resilient communities

What is the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund?

- Aid to state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments address economic fallout of pandemic, and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery
- Pinellas County allocated \$189M

What is timeline for use of funds?

- Eligible expenses starting March 3, 2021
- Must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and expended by December 31, 2026

When are key deadlines?

• Interim Recovery Plan Performance Report due by October 10, 2021, quarterly financial report October 31, 2021 and annual performance plan every December 31

Treasury Expenditure Categories



- Public Health
- Negative Economic Impacts
- Services to Disproportionately Impacted Communities
- Premium Pay for Frontline Workers
- Water, Sewer and Broadband Infrastructure
- Lost Revenue Replacement

OMB Proposed Guiding Principles



- **Strategic:** Significant investments with long-term community impact align with County strategic plan
- Prioritize Equity: Focus on disproportionately impacted communities
- **Efficient:** Minimize administrative overhead
- Accountable: Transparent with plans and achievements
- Sustainable: Be responsible stewards of public resources

Lost Revenue Replacement



- Estimated at \$25M for period ending December 31, 2020
- Maximum flexibility may be used for almost any general governmental purpose, including capital improvements
 - Accelerated road projects \$15-20M
 - Cybersecurity \$1-4M

Public Health Projects



- Mental and behavioral health: coordinated access model and Sheriff mental health squad - \$10-15M
- Hardware and software investments for public health facilities - \$8-10M

Infrastructure Projects



- Parks and playground improvements \$25-30M
 - Raymond Neri Park Construction
 - ADA Compliant Playground Updates
- Safe Routes to Schools (Sidewalks and Drainage) \$5-10M
- Stormwater Inflow and Infiltration Projects \$25-35M
- Manufactured Home Communities Wastewater Collection System \$25-30M
- Septic to Sewer Program \$10-15M
- Regional Stormwater Projects \$15-20M
 - Greater Lealman
 - Joe's Creek Trail Greenway
