Program Overview



- This program began in FY16
- The purpose of the program is to provide nonprofits in the Unincorporated areas with funding for community enhancements
- Each fiscal year, nonprofit groups can apply for funding up to \$20,000
- From FY16-FY25 the BCC has approved a total of 103 funding applications for a total of \$2M

Funding Overview



- This program is funded by the Pinellas County Unincorporated Municipal Services Taxing Unit (MSTU)
- The MSTU tax enables the County to provide the unincorporated areas with similar services to that provided by cities
- The current annual budget for this program is \$220,000
- The maximum funding is up to \$20,000

Purpose of the Proposed Updates



- 1. To formalize policy from practice
- 2. To clarify guidelines and processes for applicants
- 3. To address the increasing competitiveness of the funding moving forward
- Goal: To formalize the program via resolution in January

Purposed Changes for Consideration



1. To formalize policy from practice

- Clarifying this funding is not for community events, but community enhancements or assets
- Updating the language to state projects must be in unincorporated Pinellas County (Funded by Unincorporated MSTU)
- Adding that the project must align with the County's Strategic Plan
- Clarifying that the project cannot start prior to BCC approval

Purposed Changes for Consideration



2. To clarify guidelines and processes for applicants

- Clarifying that multiple entities will not receive funding for different components of the same project
- Clarifying that applicants may only submit one application per fiscal year
- The addition of a new section to clarify with applicants the process for payments should they be awarded funding

Purposed Changes for Consideration



3. To address the increasing competitiveness of the funding moving forward

- Establishment of a grant application period:
 - Opens October 1 and closes December 31st
 - January-February the Community Coordinators will review the submitted applications
 - The projects recommended for funding will be presented to the BCC for approval with a goal of March
