Low Income Pool (LIP) Program

#### Pool?

On October 19, 2005, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), approved the 1115 Research and Demonstration Waiver Application for the State of Florida, relating to Medicaid reform. The Florida Legislature passed <u>House Bill</u> (<u>HB</u>) <u>3B</u> [ ] 118.4 kB ], # 91, the Low Income Pool (LIP) is "established to ensure continued government support for the provision of health care services to Medicaid, underinsured and uninsured populations. The low-income pool consists of a capped annual allotment of \$1 billion total computable for each year of the 5 year demonstration period." The parameters of LIP are defined in STCs 91 through 106.

#### Who receives the Low Income Pool funds?

STC # 94 states that "LIP funds may be used for health care expenditures (medical care costs or premiums) that would be within the definition of medical assistance in <u>Section 1905(a) of the Act</u>. These health care expenditures may be incurred by the State, by hospitals, clinics, or by other provider types for uncompensated medical care costs of medical services for the uninsured, Medicaid shortfall (after all other Title XIX Low Income Pool \$35 Million LIP Primary Care Award

### Who funds the Low Income Pool?

Local governments, such as counties, hospital taxing districts and other state agencies (e.g. Florida Department of Health) provide funding for the non-federal share of the \$1 billion LIP distributions.

In accordance with HB 3 B and codified in <u>s</u>. <u>409.911(10), Florida Statutes</u> [ ], 43.4 kB ], "The Agency for Health Care Administration shall create a Medicaid Low-Income Pool Council by July 1, 2006."
