Description & Comments

This is for approval of the ranking of firms and execution of agreements with each of the seven highest ranked firms to provide contingency On-Call Professional Services for Post-Storm Recovery Services on behalf of the Building & Development Review Services Department (BDRS) and municipal partners. The seven firms are:

- 1) Tetra Tech, Inc.
- 2) Struction Solutions
- 3) AECOM Technical Services
- 4) Lemoine Disaster Recovery, LLC
- 5) Tidal Basin Government Consulting, LLC
- 6) HR Green, Inc.
- 7) Gulf Atlantic Engineers, P.A.

The contract has a term of five years with a not to exceed estimated value of \$18,000,000.00 per event, collectively among all seven vendors based upon emergency potential during a major hurricane event.

OMB Review: This item is not currently included in the budget; however, the intent is to establish a contract with a vendor to be on standby for emergency situations. Having a pre-arranged contract in place ensures that the vendor can mobilize quickly and effectively when an emergency occurs, minimizing delays in response and recovery efforts. Should an emergency arise, funding would have to be made available through a budget amendment and funding for this contract would be available through the General Fund Reserves in the event of an emergency. A portion of this future cost may be offset by reimbursement from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM).
