Authority of the Board of Adjustments and Appeals (BOAA)



Section 138.66 of the Land Development Code (LDC), Authority

- Review of all "Type 2" Applications (appoications requiring a public hearing):
 - Type 2 Uses Proposed New Use or Major Modification to Existing Use
 - Variances
 - Nonconforming Uses and Structures
- Appeals of decisions from a County Department and the Development Review Committee.
- Authority to review and decide on such other matters as assigned/delegated by the BCC or County Administrator.
- All decisions of BOAA are final and may be appealed to Circuit Court within 30 days.

Examples of Review Types



- Type 2 Reviews
 - Type 2 use 14 cases per year
 - Place of worship in residential zone
 - Variance 25 cases per year
 - Building Setback
 - Non-conforming use modification (rare)
 - Expansion of non-conforming outdoor auto repair
- Appeal of Decision from County Department or Development Review Committee (rare)
 - Review of code interpretation regarding pool display
- Delegated Authority one delegation only
 - Medical Marijuana Facility (Statute 381.986(11)(c))
