The Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners will conduct a public hearing on proposed amendments to the FY2025 Budget as required by Section 129.06 (2), Holdia Statutes, relating to the appropriation of unanticloade drevenue and realiziment as specified herein.

A public hearing on the Resolution with virtual public participation and an on-site participation option, to be held on **Tuesday**, **December 17th at 6:00 p.m.**, or thereafter, in the Palm Room, 333 Chestnut Street, Clearwater, Florida 33756, with virtual participation utilizing Communications Media Technology (CMT) on the Zoom platform.

Members of the public wishing to address the body may attend in person, attend virtually, or provide comments in advance.

To address the County Commission in person, members of the public are encouraged to preregister at Pinellas.gov/comment. Preregistration is encouraged but not required if individuals plan to attend the meeting at the Assembly Room. Those who have not preregistered may register when they arrive.

Members of the public wishing to address the body virtually via Zoom or by phone are required to preregister by 5:00 R.M. the day before the meeting by visiting <u>Pinellas.gov/comment</u>. The registration form requires full name, address, and telephone number if joining by phone, along with the topic or agenda time to be addressed. Members of the public who cannot access the registration form via the internet may call (727) 464-3000 to request assistance preregistering. Only members of the public who have preregistered by 5:00 R.M. the day before the meeting will be recognized and unmuted to offer comments. If a member of the public does not log in with the same Zoom name or phone number provided in the registration form, they may not be recognized to speak.

All comments on any agenda item received by 5:00 P.M. the day before the meeting will be included as part of the official record for this meeting and will be available to be considered by the County Commission prior to any action taken.

Written arguments, evidence, explanations, studies, reports, petitions, photos or other presentation materials and documentation that are to be presented or entered into the record for a public hearing item must be received not later than seven (7) calendar days prior to the public hearing.

Certain matters heard by the Board of County Commissioners are quasi-judicial in nature. Please note that only competent, substantial, fact-based testimony or evidence may be considered by the boards in deciding the matters before them. Pure speculation or opinion, not based on competent facts, cannot be legally considered by the boards. Lay testimony with fact-based support (including but not limited to meeting minutes, surveys, engineering reports, etc.) may be considered competent and substantial evidence. Please note County Attorney's Office represents and advises the boards and county staff but cannot give legal advice to the applicant or other interested parties.

Appeals of any quasi-judicial final decision must be filed within 30 calendar days of the decision. Persons are advised that, if they decide to appeal any decision made at this meeting/hearing, they will need a record of the proceedings, and, for such purpose, they may need to ensure that a verbatilm record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony, and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

Persons who are deaf or hard of hearing may provide public input on any agenda item through use of the State of Florida's relay service at 7-1-1.

The Resolution supplements the Fiscal Year 2025 (FY25) Adopted Budget by recognizing \$486,950 in unanticipated revenue for the ARPA Fund. It also realigns \$323,110 from the 46th Ave. N. from 49th St. N. (CR 611) to 38th St. N. Roadway Improvements Project, \$251,220 from the ARPA Human Services Software System Modernization, and \$120,600 from the ARPA Pinellas County Consolidated CAD and GIS Integration Project and appropriates \$274,460 to the Grand Canal Dredging in Tierra Verde Project, \$292,410 to the Highpoint: Russell Ave. Connection Project, \$494,410 to the Safe Routes to School Project, and \$120,600 as a Transfer to the General Fund.

Additionally, the Resolution recognizes \$120,600 in unanticipated revenue for the General Fund from the ARPA Fund transfer, which is revenue replacement, and appropriates \$120,600 to Safety and Emergency Services for Personnel Services expenditures. It also realigns \$120,600 from SES General Fund to General Fund Reserves for future contingency needs.

The total fiscal impact to the ARPA Fund is a \$486,950 increase to revenue and expenditures and includes a \$120,600 transfer from ARPA Fund to General Fund. The total fiscal impact to the General Fund is a \$120,600 increase to revenue and expenditures.

In review of the Resolution above, there may be modifications that arise at the public hearing and/or with other responsible parties.
