Review & Comments				

The OMB Grants Team has conducted a review of the **Utilities** intent to apply for the **Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)** funded by **Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)** passing through **Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM)**.

### Project Scope of Work

The department proposes to enhance the disaster resilience of the William E. Dunn Advanced Water Reclamation Facility through the acquisition of one 400kW and four 60kW pump station generators and two 6-inch bypass pumps.

### Benefit Summary

This project, submitted for funding under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), directly addresses the goal of fostering a disaster-resilient community by mitigating the risk of sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) during hurricanes and other emergency events, such as tropical storms, floods, or power outages.

### Anticipated Impact to the County Budget

This is a **Multi Year** grant affecting **FY26**, **FY27**, **FY28** & **FY29**. This Application request is for \$472,500.00 with a \$157,500.00 match required. The total project budget is estimated to be \$630,000.00.

### **Grant Review Comments**

- Funding is not in the current budget. If grant funding is awarded, the fiscal impact will be in FY26, and an analysis of the total project budget will be made at that time.
- The intended grant application will require Director approval for submission.
- The OMB Grants Team has no objection to the submittal of this grant application.
- Pursuant to Rule 27P-22, Florida Admin. Code, all project applications must go through the Local Mitigation Strategy Working Group (LMSWG) of the county where the project will take place. Project application submission requires a separate and unique endorsement letter from either the Chair or Vice-Chair of an LMSWG. This project is currently awaiting review by the LMSWG for determination of the priority ranking for submittal to FDEM.
