Description & Comments

(What is it, any issues found, is there a financial impact to current/next FY, does this contract vary from previous FY, etc.) The FDEP Agreement No. TT001 is a grant agreement between the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection and Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners for the environmental remediation of the former Toytown Class I Landfill located in Pinellas County. The landfill, which ceased operations in 1983 and was officially closed in 1990, remains in a state of long-term care due to its failure to meet stabilization requirements. The Florida Legislature appropriated \$15 million under Specific Appropriation 1755B for this remediation project, which is intended to prepare approximately 100 acres of the 250-acre site for the future development of a youth sports facility.

The scope of the project includes a preliminary engineering study, followed by environmental remediation activities such as gas control and mitigation, groundwater assessment and treatment, evaluation of land subsidence, stormwater management planning, and waste relocation (specific deliverables detailed in the Grant Work Plan). No match contribution required.

The agreement outlines administrative requirements, including quarterly progress reporting, documentation for reimbursements, and adherence to Florida and federal regulations such as the Build America, Buy America Act. FDEP reserves the right to inspect the work, enforce corrective actions, or terminate the agreement for nonperformance. Additional provisions cover insurance, subcontracting, audit readiness, and prohibitions against lobbying and unauthorized employment.

Funding is programmed in the FY25 Adopted Budget in the Capital Improvement Program, under project Toytown Remediation Phase 1 (005583A) in the amount of \$15,000,000.00.
