

# **COMPLIANCE CONCERNS**

- Wetland impacts not covered by existing WMD permit; County staff did not consult with WMD or obtain prior permit amendments before clearing and grading.
- Florida Division of Historical
  Resources documented
  archaeological site; no evaluation
  was conducted prior to site selection
  or digging.
- Project does not meet the 25-foot setback requirement from mangroves
- Project threatens to degrade
   Outstanding Florida Waters
   protected by Florida law.




## **ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS**

- Within 25 feet of a state aquatic preserve, project conflicts with the objectives of aquatic preserve's management plan.
- Within 25 feet of state-designated critical foraging habitat; project threatens to diminish water quality for endangered wildlife.
- Removal of old-growth, mature trees cannot be adequately mitigated.
- Flood zone designation and climate change projections make site unsuitable. Marine debris, chemical pollutants, and increased runoff/flooding cannot be prevented.



## **COMMUNITY CONCERNS**

- Documented safety concerns
   associated with current site now move into a residential area and community park with playground.
- Proximity to residences much closer (within 100') than at other park recycling facilities.
- Noise, smell, wildlife attractants, litter, and illegal dumping are valid concerns documented at other sites.
- *Increased runoff and flooding* at this high-velocity and low elevation site.
- Increased large-vehicle traffic on a 1-lane road, DeSoto Boulevard.
