The Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners proposes to adopt the following Ordinance amending the Pinellas County Future Land Use Map and Resolutions amending the Zoning Atlas.

A public hearing on the Ordinance and Resolutions with virtual public participation and an on-site participation option, to be held on **Tuesday, June 11, 2024, at 9:30 A.M.** or thereafter in the Palm Room, 333 Chestnut Street, Clearwater, Florida 33756, with virtual participation utilizing Communications Media Technology (CMT) on the Zoom platform.

Members of the public wishing to address the body may attend in person, attend virtually, or provide comments in advance.

Written arguments, evidence, explanations, studies, reports, petitions, photos or other presentation materials and documentation that are to be presented or entered into the record for a public hearing item must be received not later than seven (7) calendar days prior to the public hearing.

Certain matters heard by the Board of County Commissioners are quasi-judicial in nature. Please note that only competent, substantial, fact-based testimony or evidence may be considered by the boards in deciding the matters before them. Pure speculation or opinion, not based on competent facts, cannot be legally considered by the boards. Lay testimony with fact-based support (including but not limited to meeting minutes, surveys, engineering reports, etc.) may be considered competent and substantial evidence. Please note county attorney's office represents and advises the boards and county staff but cannot give legal advice to the applicant or other interested natives.

Appeals of any quasi-judicial final decision must be filed within 30 calendar days of the decision Appeals of any quast-judicial intal decision must be filled within 30 calendar days of the decision. Persons are advised that, if they decide to appeal any decision made at this meeting/hearing, they will need a record of the proceedings, and, for such purpose, they may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

Persons who are deaf or hard of hearing may provide public input on any agenda item through use of the State of Florida's relay service at 7-1-1.

(Quasi-Judicial)


In review of the Ordinance and Resolutions above, there may be modifications that arise at the public hearing and/or with other responsible parties.
