REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS B. CPA Actions and Forward Pinellas Administrative Review Items	Rodney Chatman advised the PAC members that the Countywide Planning Authority (CPA) approved two land use cases at its August 13 th meeting and provided the details of the changes to the Countywide Map for each case. He advised that Forward Pinellas staff processed three Tier I amendments in July and August. There were no map adjustments to report.	
4. PLANNING TOPICS OF INTEREST A. Business Impact Estimates	Linda Fisher reminded the PAC members about a new law that will take affect on October 1, 2024 regarding business impact statements. She explained that the law resulted from SB170 that was passed during the 2023 legislative session. Ms. Fisher outlined the requirements of the new law and cautioned the members that the bill also allows for challenges to be brought forward. When originally passed in 2023, the bill did not apply to land use matters. However, SB1628 that passed during the 2024 session changed that. She advised that rezonings and private party initiated matters are still exempt under that latest bill. An example business impact statement was shared for reference.	
B. Housing Toolkit Study	Linda Fisher briefly reviewed the work that has been done to date concerning the Advantage Pinellas Housing Compact and advised that the Housing Toolkit would be forthcoming soon. Ms. Fisher provided an overview of the toolkit's intended purpose and current status. She highlighted the topics that would be included and offered a timeline to completion. She stated a draft has been developed and is being crosschecked for conformity with the Countywide Rules. Ms. Fisher encouraged additional partners to sign the compact and advised that those who are part of the compact will be given first preference for technical assistance. Lastly, Ms. Fisher advised that in spring 2025 there will be another Homes for Pinellas Summit.	

C. Future Knowledge Exchange Series Topic	Emma Wennick, Forward Pinellas staff, offered a presentation covering each of the suggested topics for the next Knowledge Exchange Series (KES). These included: Green Infrastructure, Surplus of Auto-Oriented Uses, and the Live Local Act. Ms. Wennick provided an overview and study approach for each of the suggested topics.
	The PAC members were asked to submit ballot forms to vote for the topics they were most interested in.
	After an inquiry by Derek Kilborn about the intended audience, there was some brief discussion about ensuring the KES is written in a way that allows for public consumption. Specifically, he recognized how the KES on Missing Middle Housing was done in a way that was ideal for educating members of the public as needed. Ms. Wennick will review the ballots and report back on the results at a later meeting.

C. <u>Local Planning Grant Reminder</u>	Rodney Chatman reminded the PAC members of the deadlines and requirements for submitting a Local Planning Grant application. He encouraged interested local governments to reach out to Forward Pinellas staff and to submit applications.

	on text regulations. Andrew Morris advised that the Tampa Bay	
	Regional Planning Council helped the City of	
	Madeira Beach with the John's Pass Village	
	rezoning project to make visual aides that	
	showed what the Activity Center could look	
	like.	
	Jayme Lopko shared about a workshop the	
	city holds with the North Greenwood CRA	
	deemed "The Game of Zones." The hands-on	
	workshop uses 3-D scale models to	
	demonstrate what types of structures can be	
	build on the smaller lots in that area and what	
	the resulting neighborhood can look like. She	
	encouraged others to attend for ideas and distributed flyers with additional information.
