OMB has no objection to the department submitting a grant application to the Florida Department of Children and Families to obtain funding to expand the Office of the Public Defender's Pinellas County Jail Diversion Program.

Requested funding is \$1,200,000 over three years (\$400,000 per fiscal year) from the Criminal Justice, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant program. A match is required, \$1,200,000, and will be provided by two partners of the project: Public Defender (cash) and WestCare GulfCoast-Florida, Inc. (in-kind). Other partners are the Sixth Judicial Circuit and Vincent House.

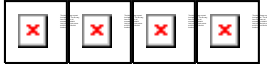

| Proposed Abstract (Project Scope of Work) | <p>The Office of the Public Defender, Sixth Judicial Circuit, and its partners WestCare GulfCoast-Florida, Inc. and Vincent House, propose to work in partnership with Pinellas County and the Public Safety Coordinating Council to administer a CJMHSA Reinvestment Grant of \$1.2M over 36 months. The proposed program, A Turning Point (ATP), is an expansion of the Office of the Public Defender's Pinellas County Jail Diversion Program.</p> <p>This unique diversion project will offer a structured shelter/treatment program to 100 unduplicated individuals annually (300 over 36 months). The population of focus is adults who have a substance use disorder, as well as, a co-occurring mental health condition, and have been charged with a crime.</p> |
| Benefit Summary (How will this benefit the County, Dept, etc?) | <p>The primary goal of ATP is to divert high-risk individuals (high systems users) from arrest, prosecution, or incarceration to treatment and support services.</p> <p>Anticipated outcomes include a decrease in recidivism, relapse, and risk factors/behaviors; and increases/improvements in employment, housing stability, self-sufficiency, overall health, and social connectedness, among others.</p> <p>The proposed expansion is needed because the Office of the Public Defender reports that the number of eligible individuals (chronic inebriates with co-occurring behavioral health disorders) outnumbers the capacity of its current Jail Diversion program.</p> |
