## **Description & Comments**

The attached forms are required by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS)'s Emergency Watershed Protection program. Funding through this program was originally applied for by County Administration in 2024 following the impacts of Hurricanes Helene and Milton, which resulted in a significant amount of debris impacting canals and waterways throughout the County.

Funding through this program is provided on a reimbursement basis through the United States Department of Agriculture as they are the first-resort funding source for this type of post-disaster work; funding for this work was not applied for through the Federal Emergency Management Agency as that agency is the funding source of *last* resort for this manner of post-disaster work.

Federal cost-share for this work will reimburse 75% of eligible expenses related to the debris clearance activities, and initial funding will be derived from the County's Capital Improvement Plan funds.

After these forms are authorized, the NRCS will generate a grant agreement for the County, and an additional Granicus Review will be attached to that agreement which will cover specific financial impacts. Funding for this item is not budgeted for Fiscal Year 25.
