

RESOLUTION 05- 59

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF PINELLAS COUNTY CREATING A
MUNICIPAL RECYCLING REIMBURSEMENT GRANT
PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Pinellas County Solid Waste Disposal and Resource Recovery System was created by Chapter 75-487, Laws of Florida; and

WHEREAS, that Special Act, as amended, has been codified in the Pinellas County Code in sections 106-51 through 106-70; and

WHEREAS, recycling resources and removing them from the solid waste stream furthers the intent of the Pinellas County Solid Waste Disposal and Resource Recovery System and is an appropriate function of the system; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners are authorized under both Chapter 75-487, Laws of Florida, as amended and, 163.01, Florida Statutes (2003) to contract with other local governments to expand the system where necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners hereby finds that it is necessary and advisable to expand the Pinellas County Solid Waste Disposal and Resource Recovery System by promoting greater recycling in both the unincorporated and incorporated portions of Pinellas County; and

WHEREAS, the municipalities within Pinellas County have shown interest in receiving funds derived from Pinellas County Solid Waste Disposal and Resource Recovery System revenues to aid the expansion of, provision of, and education relating to, recycling services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF PINELLAS COUNTY, in regular session duly assembled this

5 day of April, 2005, that:

- 1) The Pinellas County Recycling Reimbursement Grant Program
("Program") is hereby created from Solid Waste Disposal and Resource
Recovery System funds contained within the Pinellas County Department
of Solid Waste Operations (SWO) budget item, "Aid to Government
Agencies." The Program funds shall be extended to Municipalities within
Pinellas County, on a reimbursement basis, for the purpose of supporting
and expanding the activities of their materials recycling and recycling
education programs upon submittal of appropriate documentation as
required herein.
- 2) The Pinellas County Director of Solid Waste Operations, or his designee
(DSWO), shall administer the Program as follows:
 - a) Upon adoption of this Resolution and in subsequent fiscal years, the
DSWO shall allocate and distribute the amount of Program funds
approved by the Board of County Commissioners for the applicable fiscal
year in accordance with this Resolution. The available Program funds for
fiscal year 2004-2005 shall be \$350,000 of the amount listed in the SWO
budget item, "Aid to Government Agencies."
 - b) Program funds shall be allocated to eligible participants on the basis of a
pro rata share of the total Program funds available to all Program
participants on the basis of incorporated population, as of the date of
application, as determined by the most recent population census

determination under §186.901, Florida Statutes. For example, if participant City A has a population of 10,000 and participant City B has a population of 20,000 and participant City C has a population of 70,000, the relative shares of the Program monies available would be 10% to City A, 20% to City B and 70% to City C.

- c) Program funds once allocated shall be distributed on a reimbursement basis only. Reimbursement shall be limited to expenditures directly related to and supporting recycling, including: equipment for recycling facility, recycling personnel costs, operation of recycling facility/program, purchase materials made from recycled materials, public education, and construction of recycling facility. Reimbursement shall be based upon submittals on a SWO Program reimbursement form and shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A. Reimbursements for the final portion of the last quarter of each Program year (July – September) must be submitted no later than September 15.
- d) Upon approval of the fiscal year budget for Utilities, Department of Solid Waste Operations, the DSWO shall determine the exact amount of the Program award and shall notify each municipality, in writing, of their allocation for the upcoming fiscal year.
- e) Each recipient of Program funds shall maintain accurate records of all expenditures of Program funds, and shall assure that these records are available at all reasonable times for inspection, review or audit by SWO personnel or County auditors. Records shall be kept for at least three years.

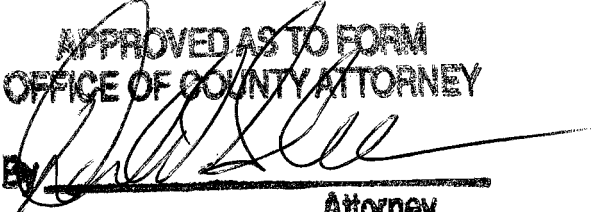
This resolution will become effective upon its adoption.

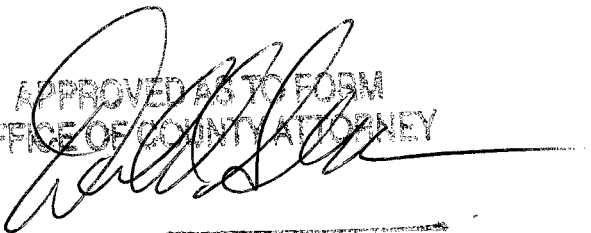
