Description & Comments

This Agreement between the County and five municipalities and independent fire districts is the result of a collaborative effort to manage the growth of Emergency Medical Service (EMS) incidents and to make sure that appropriate resources are dispatched to each incident. The agreement is designed to keep Advanced Life Support (ALS) First Responders available for incidents such as life-threatening emergencies, fire suppression and other hazardous emergencies. Incidents that are not life-threatening and do not require ALS First Responders would have ambulance only responses to those incidents allowing ALS First Responders to remain available to respond to other life-threatening emergencies.

Growth management initiatives will also be implemented to reduce the demand for EMS services through public education and community outreach. These programs will be for segments of patients not experiencing life threatening or potentially life-threatening emergencies.

The term of this Agreement will be in effect through September 30, 2019. This Agreement has options for three (3) additional one (1) year extensions following the initial term.

No immediate fiscal impact is anticipated with this implementation. As this effort is implemented and further analyzed, efficiencies may be noticed and have future fiscal impacts.
