SUMMARY

From: Industrial (I) & Target Employment Center

To: Multimodal Corridor (MMC) & Target Employment Center

Area: 3.7 acres m.o.l.

Location: Generally bounded by 6th Avenue S., 22nd Street S., 8th Avenue S./I-275, and 23rd Street

This proposed amendment is submitted by the City of St. Petersburg and seeks to amend 25 parcels known as St. Petersburg Commerce Park. The subject property is vacant. It is located within the boundaries of the Palmetto Park Neighborhood Association, the Deuces Live Main Street and the Warehouse Arts District. If approved, this amendment will accommodate the anticipated job-generating redevelopment activity sought by the City for the St. Petersburg Commerce Park area.
