Preventing Child Abuse/Breaking Its Intergenerational Link	\$60,491	Funding to provide housing, counseling, and case management services to teen/young mothers at Alpha House with a focus on breaking the cycle of child abuse and transitioning mothers into stable housing.
In Touch With Communities Around the World, Inc. d/b/a Arts Conservatory for Teens (ACT)	Teens Empowered Today	\$49,000	Provide at-risk youth, ages 11-18, access to after-school prevention program that provides education and mentoring. Focus on citizenship, leadership, education, health awareness, and cultural enrichment.
Boys & Girls Club of the Suncoast	Project Learn	\$30,000	Project Learn reinforces the academic enrichment and school engagement of young people during the time they spend at the Club by providing high-yield learning activities and encourage parent involvement.
City of Clearwater	Mental Health Check Team Project	\$18,720	Clearwater PD will work with a mental health service provider to connect mentally ill individuals with appropriate services in effort to reduce law enforcement encounters.
City of St. Petersburg	St. Petersburg Police Department Prevention and Safety Program	\$18,845 (1) \$14,655 (2) \$4,190	Two Requests: (1) Obtain tools to educate teens about the dangers of alcohol and substance use and driving impaired and/or distracted. (2) Purchase ductless fume hoods for staff safety for processing unidentified substances that have been recovered and require testing to identify the substance.
Community Tampa Bay	ANYTOWN Youth Leadership & Diversity Education Program	\$10,570	Program for youth ages 14-18 learn about the impact, causes and consequences of stereotypes, prejudice, and discrimination. Program provides students the foundation for building leadership skills.
D.R.E.A.M. "Developing, Refreshing, & Empowering All Minds" Inc.	AICISIS (Abstinence In Crime Success In School) Program	\$24,570	Program for at-risk youth ages 8-13 where twice a week youth participate in life skills, crime prevention, and positive behavioral educational programs. Program for youth in 33755 & 33870 zip codes with school and police force partners.
Family Resources, Inc.	Community Placement Intake Services	\$53,708	Conduct screening & assessment of youth brought to the Pinellas Juvenile Assessment Center. Programs provides youth with efficient access to needed services and shelter in one location.

Golden Generations, Inc.	My Sistah's Place	\$27,190	Provide life skills services to young women who have aged out of foster care, ages 18-21, through education, employment training, vocational skills development, housing placement, and entrepreneurship training.
MORE HEALTH	Firearm Safety and Violence Prevention Project	\$34,956	Funding to provide Firearm Safety Education Lessons to Pinellas County Public Schools' third and sixth grade students. All of Pinellas County's public third grade classes are offered this safety lesson.
PACE Center for Girls, Inc.	Spirited Girls!	\$10,000	PACE is a school for at-risk girls, Spirited Girls! Is an elective course offered at the school that is a gender-sensitive program designed to teach young girls physical and mental health life-skills.
Pinellas County Sheriff's Office (PCSO)	Sexual Predator & Offender Tracking (SPOT) Unit Deputy	\$99,892	Funding to maintain SPOT unit including salary for SPOT deputy to register, monitor, track, apprehend and provide community updates on sexual predators.
Suncoast Center, Inc.	Forensic Focused Outreach	\$40,000	Program provides psychiatric evaluations, mental health assessments, screenings, counseling, therapy, and case management to assist clients in achieving self-sufficiency and re-integration into the community.
Westcare	Mustard Seed Inn	\$50,000	Grant will fund case management for Transitional housing program that assists adults with substance abuse and/or co-occurring mental health disorders to obtain and stay substance free, learn how to cope with crisis, learn how to stay safe, obtain employment, and connected to other services as needed.
