The OMB Grants Team has conducted a review of the **Human Services** intent to apply for the **Health Center Program** funded by the **U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)**.

Project Scope of Work

This application for federal funding supports the County's Health Care for the Homeless program for a four-year project period starting March 1, 2026, through February 28, 2030. Funding in the amount of \$1,900,000.00 is for the first budget year starting March 1, 2026, through February 28, 2027. The purpose of this grant program is to improve the health of the Nation's underserved communities and vulnerable populations by assuring continued access to comprehensive, culturally competent, quality primary health care services. The program provides basic health care services on the Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) and at Bayside Health Clinic.
