**Date/Time/Comments:** 9/04/19 Approval and execution by the County Administrator of the Agreements with Pinellas Ex-Offender Re-Entry Coalition, Inc. (PERC), Pinellas County Urban League, Inc. (PCUL), and Area Agency on Aging of Pasco-Pinellas, Inc. (AAAPP) for continued services. Reviewed prior Funding Agreement under 18-1180D. No changes in FY20. Assignment of insurance will be the same limits as the prior agreement except auto liability requirements which is removed. The risk is moderate.

**NOTES:** These Agreements for three (3) community agencies reflect the decision package funding recommendations approved by the Board for FY20. The programs address community need within the areas of job training and support, support services for youth and food/nutritional services for disadvantaged residents and an aging population. Funding will support approximately six (6) months of partial program operations.

The PERC Agreement provides funding to support and expand the STARS program. STARS will provide job training, support and placement for individuals whom are hard to place in employment. Since our funding began in FY19 they have had a job placement rate of over 70%.

The PCUL Agreement provides funding to support the UYEP for youth ages 14-24 who are considered at-risk and reside in targeted communities within Pinellas County. UYEP works with youth to remove barriers to economic and educational success by providing comprehensive workforce and career development support, as well as wraparound case management. The program assisted 100 youths during FY19.

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The AAAPP Agreement provides funding for home delivered meals for seniors in Pinellas County. The pilot program began in FY19 as an alternative for senior meal deliveries. The program began feeding clients in March 2019 and have served 82 clients. Based off of a national model, the core of STARS is a four-week training workshop that takes a tough love, no excuse approach to work readiness. The curriculum delves into the root causes of a person's inability to obtain and keep a job. All program graduates receive two years of follow-up services including employment development/placement. Since the relaunch in mid-2017, there have been 73 successful completions with many participants receiving multiple certifications. They are currently operating with a 70% job placement rate.

PCUL was founded in 1978 and provides workforce development, health initiatives, and education and financial empowerment for underserved populations. At the local level through UYEP, PCUL expects that 30% of program participants will complete an internship or be placed in unsubsidized employment, 25% will be placed in post-secondary education or obtain certification, and 70% will increase life and employability skills, as well as complete financial empowerment training.

The Area Agency on Aging of Pasco-Pinellas, Inc. (AAAPP) is a non-profit agency serving seniors and their caregivers in Pasco and Pinellas. AAAPP is focused on funding, advocacy, services and programs for seniors. AAAPP will continue to administer this meal delivery program to prevent food insecurity among seniors and will contract with a Pinellas based agency to deliver the meals through their coordinated meal preparation and delivery infrastructure.
