Description & Comments

This agreement establishes that Pinellas County will retain ASRus, LLC to provide professional engineering consulting services for the design, permitting, bidding, and construction support of Senate Bill 64 compliance injection wells. The consultant is responsible for preparing plans and specifications, securing required permits, supporting procurement and construction, and ensuring compliance with applicable standards and schedules, while the County provides oversight, project data, and payment under specified fee and performance terms. The contract also outlines deliverables, timelines, compensation, and accountability for accuracy and compliance throughout all project phases.*

Florida Senate Bill 64 requires many wastewater utilities to eliminate non-beneficial surface-water discharges of treated effluent and transition to beneficial reuse or other management strategies. The law sets a general deadline of January 1, 2032 for eliminating those discharges, while allowing alternatives such as reclaimed water reuse, storage, aquifer recharge, or deep injection where appropriate to achieve compliance. Its intent is to protect Florida's water resources by reducing routine disposal to surface waters and expanding sustainable reuse of treated wastewater.

Funding is budgeted under Alternative Wastewater Effluent Disposal Facilities project 006176A, included in the FY26-FY31 Capital Improvement Plan, funded by the Sewer Renewal and Replacement Fund in the amount of \$4,050,000.00. The six-year plan also includes estimated construction costs of \$12,000,000.00, which will require additional revenue or financing.
