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Pinellas: Vacancies Announced on the Pinellas County Construction Licensing Board *Applications are due by 3 pm February 18, 2026.*

Applications are now being accepted to fill two (2) vacancies on the Pinellas County Construction Licensing Board (“PCCLB”). The PCCLB consists of 15 members from various trades, along with building officials, a fire official, and two consumer representatives.

Applicants are sought for the following areas:

- **Residential Contractor licensed to do business in the state and actively engaged in the profession** – The person selected for this position will complete a current 4-year term set to expire in September 2026 but would be eligible to reapply.
- **South County Building Official** from one of the following municipalities: St. Petersburg, South Pasadena, Gulfport, Seminole, Kenneth City, or Pinellas Park – Government building officials are not term limited.

All members of the PCCLB are appointed by the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners (“BCC”) and must be residents of Pinellas County (except for the building officials). Each member of the PCCLB, other than the building official, the architect, and the consumer member, must personally hold an unexpired certified license issued by the City of St. Petersburg, the City of Clearwater, the County of Pinellas, or the State of Florida at the time of appointment; be actively engaged in his or her respective business and have been so engaged for a period of at least 5 consecutive years before the date of appointment; and be a citizen and resident of the county. The BCC will appoint members to four-year terms. PCCLB members may not serve more than two consecutive terms but may be reappointed after a two-year hiatus. However, the limitation does not apply to any of the governmental buildings official or fire official appointees. The PCCLB must elect a chair and vice chair to serve two-year terms in those positions.

Each PCCLB Member must file an annual financial disclosure FORM 1 by July 1 for the prior year (see:
