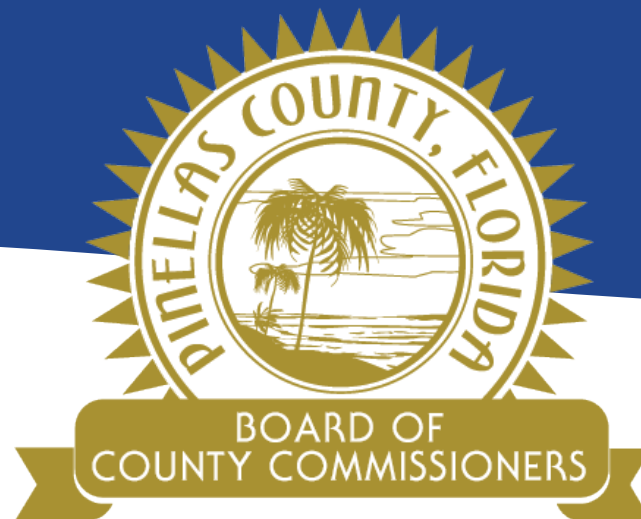

Project Background



Purpose of the Project

- The overall goal of the new Pinellas County Jail SEC facility is to enhance security and to provide a new building for public access and inmate release, combining and consolidating existing functions at the current jail to create a new single point of entry for the entire jail campus.
- The facility will keep short-term public visitors on the public side of the site.
- Allow for the screening of longer-term visitors (attorneys, clergy, etc.) for access to the secure portion of the site.
- The facility is designed to direct vehicles entering the secure portion of the site to a single point of entry, where all vehicles will be screened.
- Public parking for all public visitors is provided outside the secure fencing in the new design.

- Canopy Cover for All Lanes

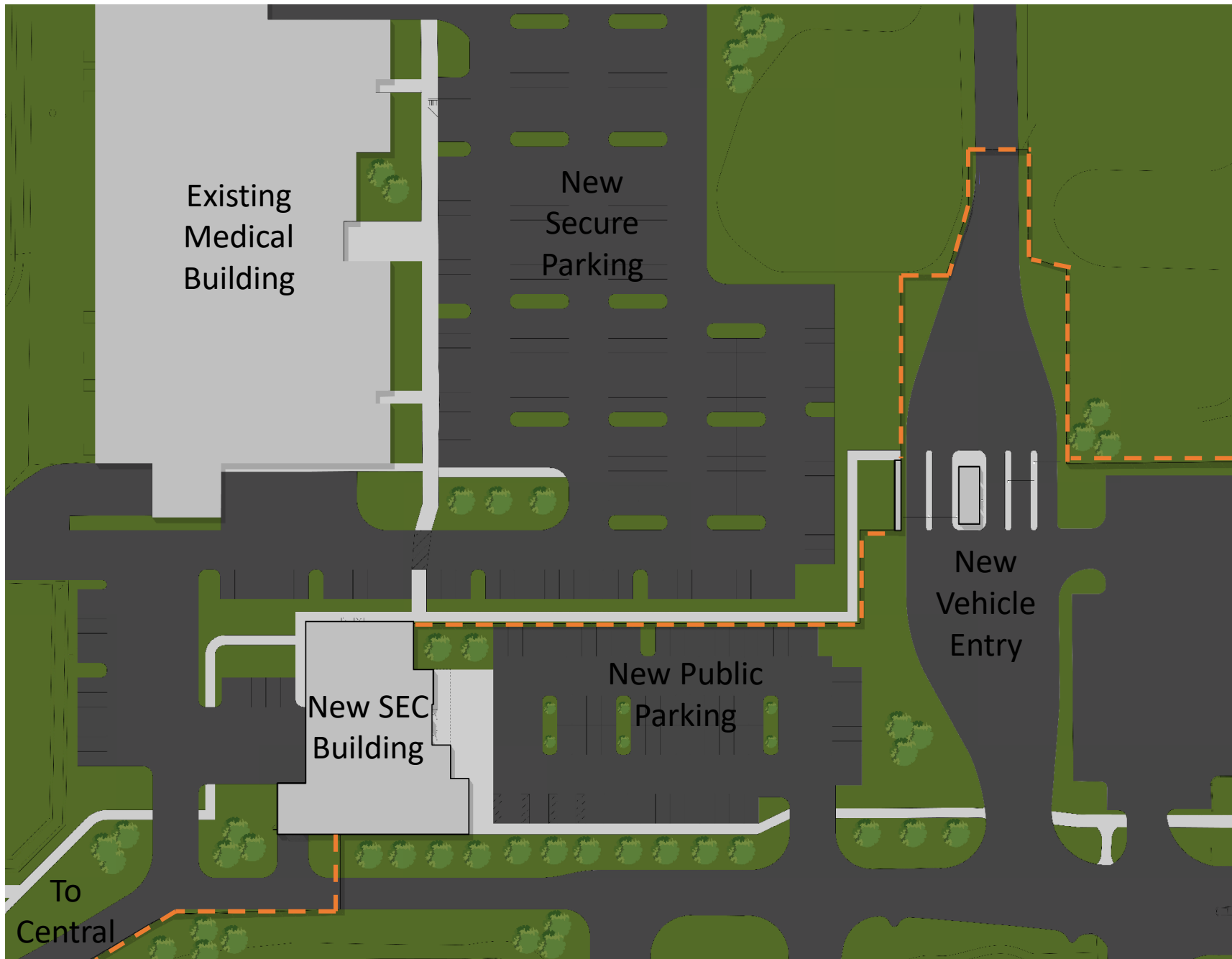

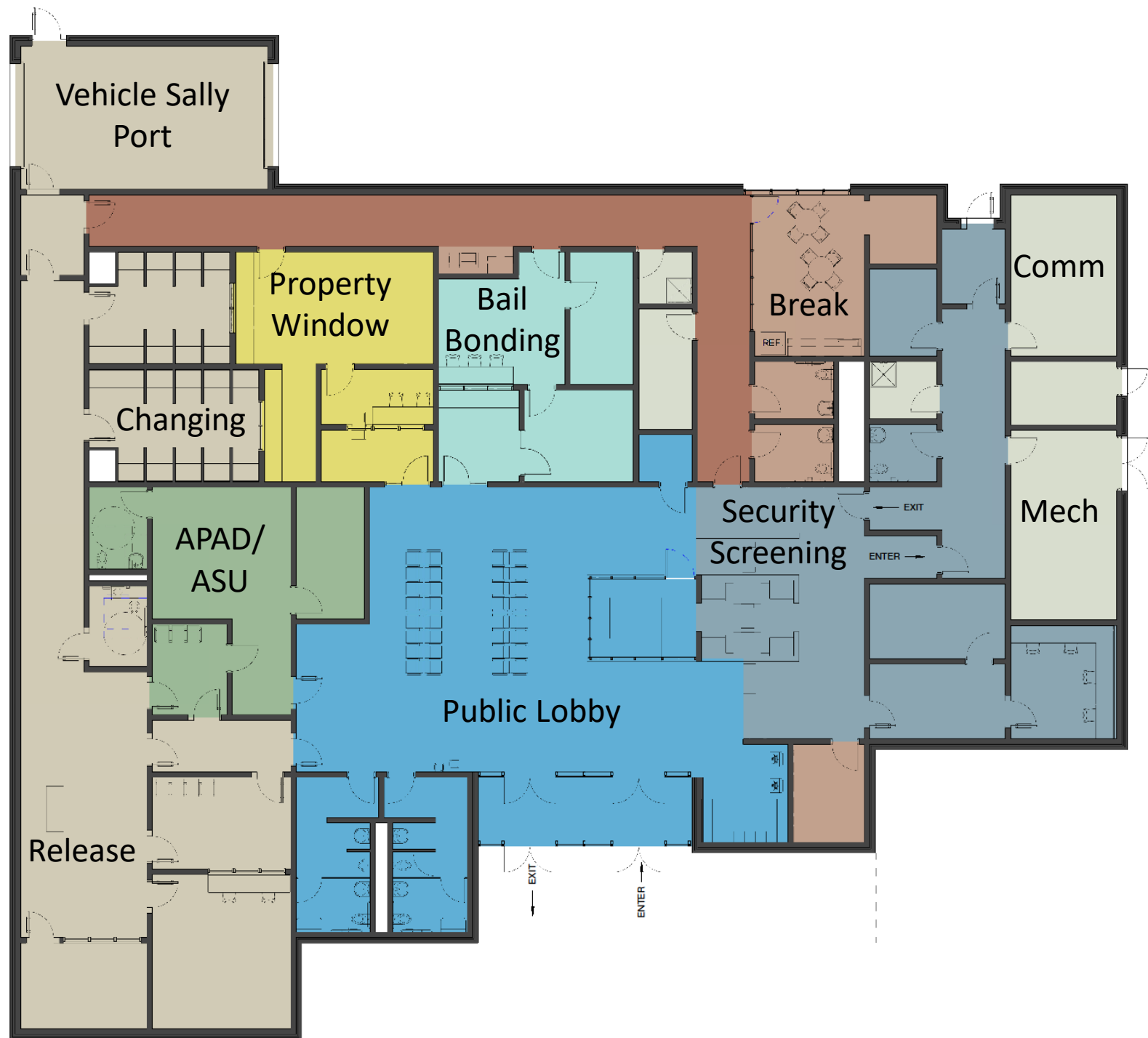

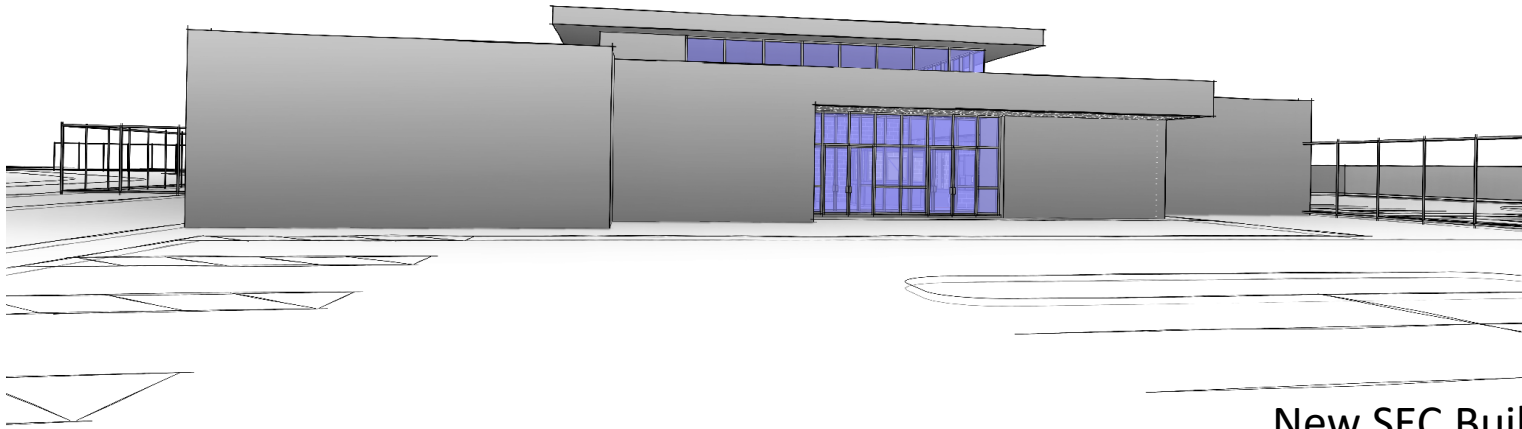
SEC Site Plan



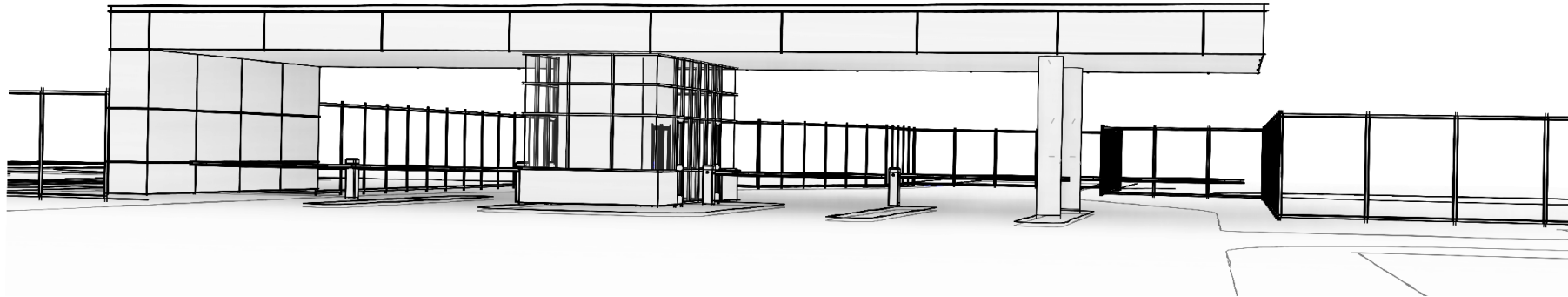

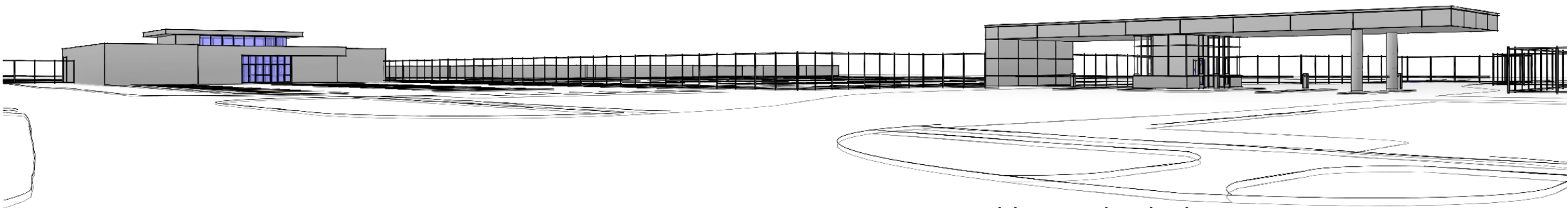
SEC Floor Plan
