Approval of Utility Agreements with the three manufactured home communities included in the project package 2 construction agreement with Cathcart Construction Company of Florida, LLC (Legistar 24-1231A).

The agreements enable the County to own, operate, and maintain a sanitary sewer collection system within the applicable communities and include easement rights and Rights-To-Use for dedicated Right-of-ways that are free of restrictions.

Funding for the construction contract with Cathcart Construction Company of Florida, LLC is available under Manufactured Home Communities Wastewater Collection Systems Improvements Project 005015A, included in the Capital Improvement Plan, funded by the American Rescue Plan Act Fund, Restore Act federal grant funding, and Resilient Florida Grant Program federal grant funds passed through the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, in the amount of \$37,994,000.

Three contracts for completion of Manufactured Home Communities Wastewater Collection Systems Improvements Project 005015A will be recommended. The first two packages, to be recommended to the Board of County Commissioners on August 13, 2024, are fully funded in the FY25-30 Proposed Capital Improvement Plan.

ARPA funding must be fully expended by December 31, 2026, and \$25,000,000 in Florida Resilient funding must be fully expended by June 30, 2026.
