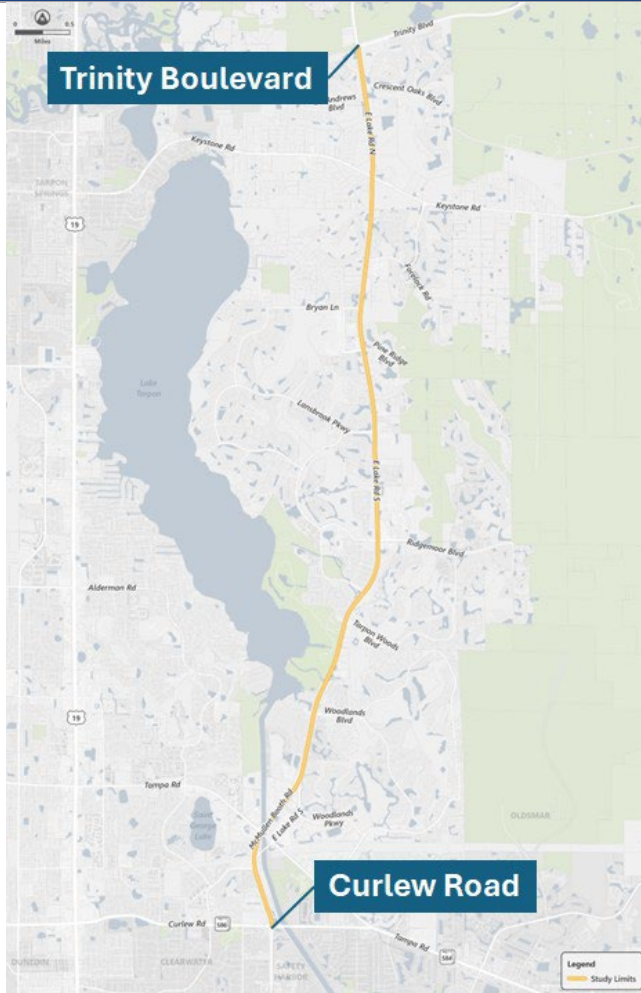

OFF-SIS FIXED GUIDEWAY TRANSIT			
<i>Projects must be rated medium or higher using the State New Starts Transit Program (NSTP) criteria and must demonstrate congestion relief benefits to the SIS. Note that although NSTP funds right of way acquisition, design, construction, and rolling stock, SIS will only fund the construction phase of off-SIS fixed guideway transit projects. Additionally, the project must be an eligible off-SIS project type to be considered for SIS funding. *Lane repurposing projects must go through the lane repurposing process in addition to meeting the off-SIS criteria.</i>

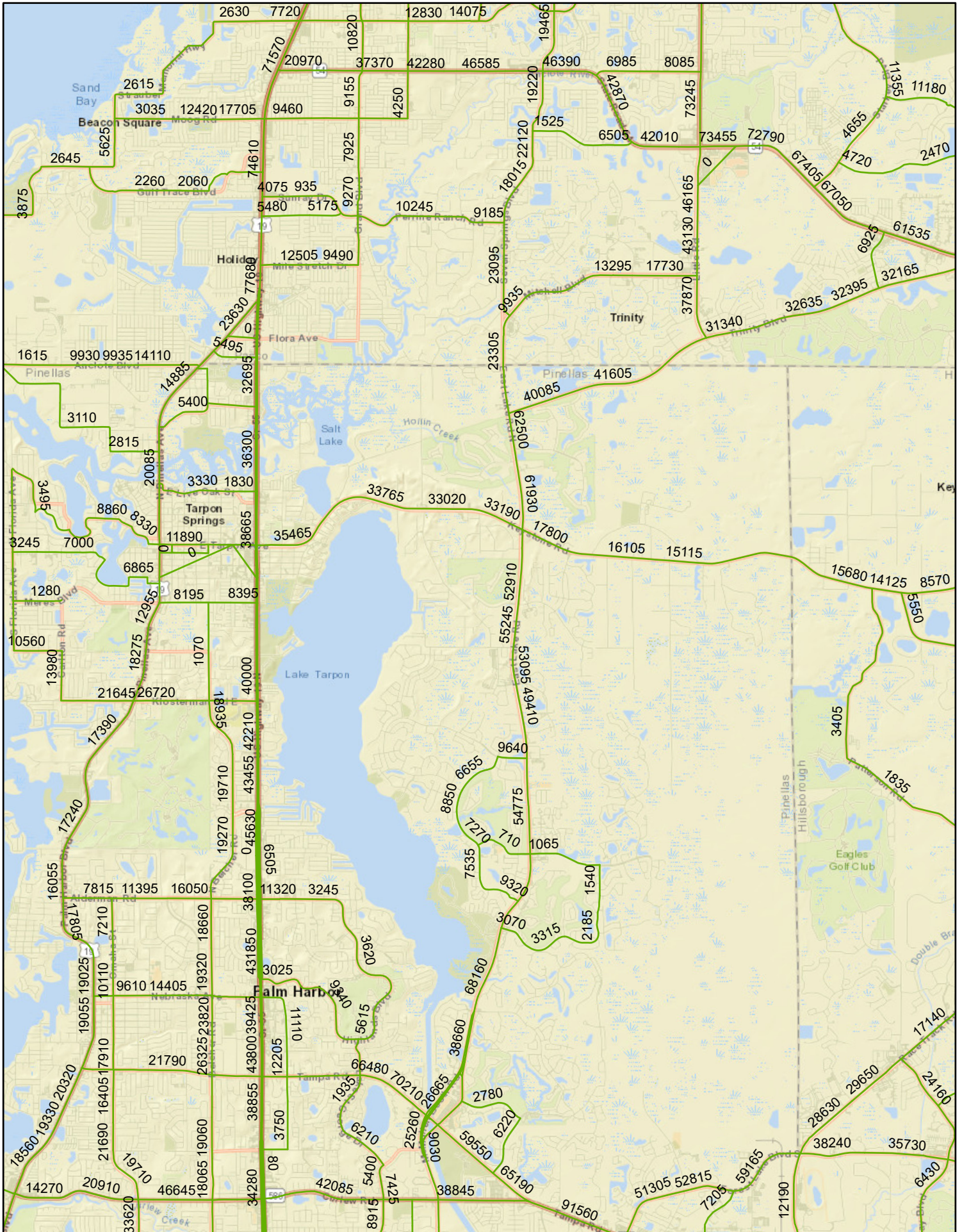

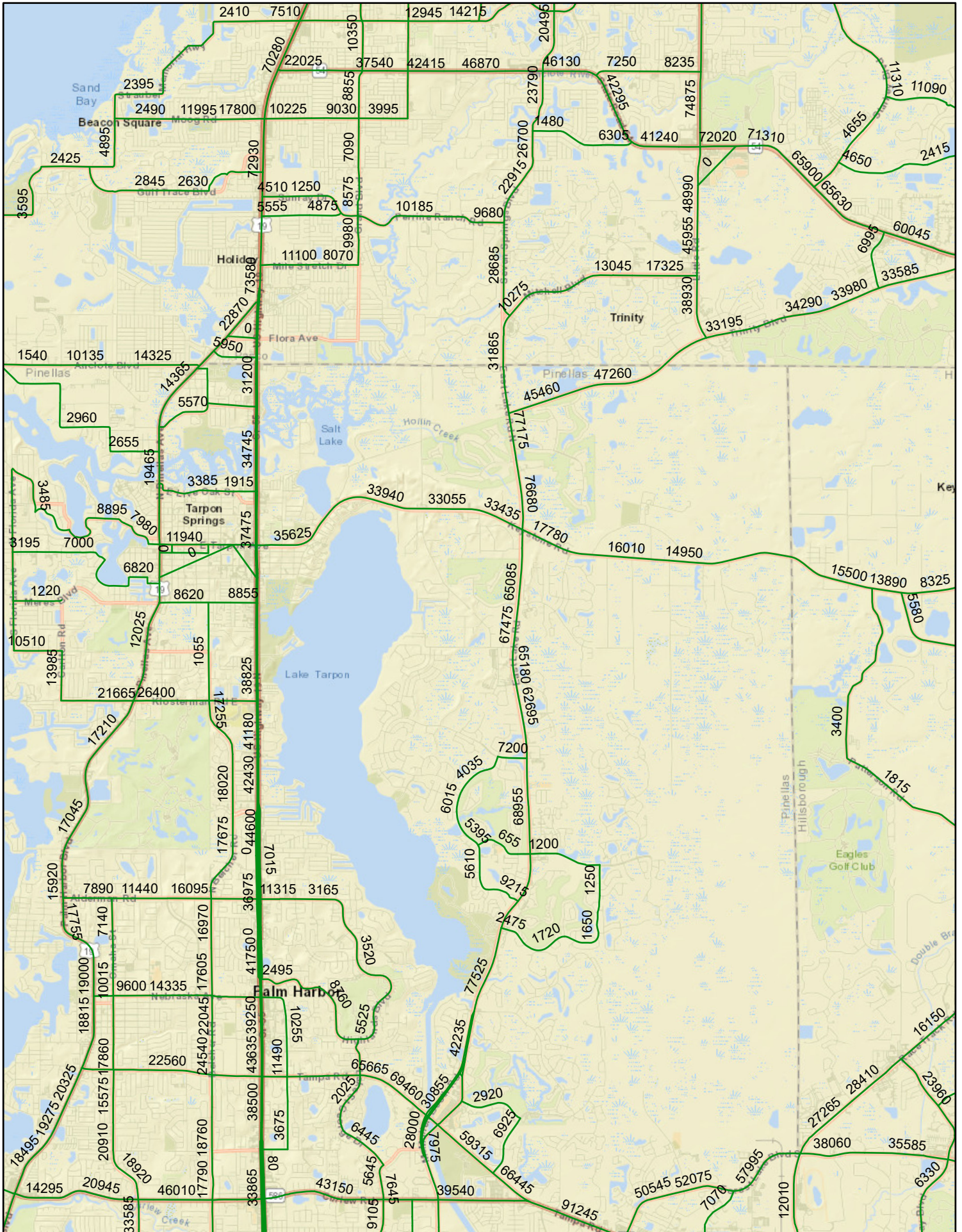
