Human Services is requesting approval and execution by the County Administrator of the Tangible Personal Property Report (SF-428), as required by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), for closeout of the First Responders Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (FR-CARA) grant that funded the FY2021 Pinellas County First Responder and Community Education and Engagement Program.

- The County’s FR-CARA project was initiated to enhance the current first responder’s naloxone program throughout Pinellas County by creating additional training opportunities, increasing community access to a drug or device for opioid reversal, and by increasing connections and engagements in community substance use treatment services.
- The \$1,999,996.00 federal grant award primarily funded a Quick Response Team and community naloxone training services for the period of September 30, 2021 through December 29, 2025. Additional components of the program included next of kin interviews for overdose fatality reviews and respite care for overdose survivors.
- SAMHSA requires completion of a Tangible Personal Property Report for award closeout to document the acquisition of equipment, or lack thereof, with federal grant funding.
- Approval of this report has no fiscal impact on Pinellas County.
