(What is it, any issues found, is there a financial impact to current/next FY, does this contract vary from previous FY, etc.) This is for the approval and execution by the County Administrator of the Medicaid Public Emergency Medical Transportation Letter of Agreement with the Agency for Health Care Administration to participate in the PEMT Medicaid Managed Assistance plan via an Intergovernmental Transfer program.

The PEMT IGT is an annual program that supplements unreimbursed costs associated with emergency ambulance transportation services. Eligibility of the program is associated with emergency ambulance transportation provided by public entities to Medicaid recipients enrolled in MMA plans. Projected net revenue is \$9,256,782.53 to the Emergency Medical Services Fund in FY25.

The funding is consistent and included in the FY25 Budget. Total distributions received from MMA plans are projected at \$16,191,678.38, which offset a projected expenditure of \$6,934,895.85, resulting in net revenue of \$9,256,782.53. The amounts submitted in the budget were higher and based on historical actuals, the IGT transfer was included in the FY25 budget at \$11,112,200 and the Gross Revenues were budgeted at \$22,826,000. The amounts are subject to change. AHCA has indicated the decrease is driven by a decrease in transport volume throughout the State of Florida, although transport volume in Pinellas County has increased.
