### Description & Comments

An application for grant funding from the Florida Resilient Grant Program for the replacement of the Gulf Beach Potable Water Booster Station, improving resilience for a key infrastructure component in the County’s drinking water supply for South County and the Gulf Beaches.

Pinellas County Utilities is requesting \$8,000,000 in grant funding, with a required 50%, or \$8,000,000 match. Grant funding will be available July 1, 2025, and expenditures made after that date are eligible to satisfy the match requirement.

Grant funds will be applied to Gulf Beach Pump Station Upgrades Project 002150A, included in the Capital Improvement Plan. Matching funds are available under the same project, funded by the Water Renewal and Replacement Fund, in the amount of \$16,657,000.

Anticipated grant funding is not included in the FY25-30 Proposed Capital Improvement Plan.
