Helping residents recover from storms

Hurricane Helene's storm surge tore through the streets as Sherri Evans and her daughter could only watch in horror from her daughter's second-story apartment on Treasure Island. FOX 13's Kailey Tracy reports.

Local Treasure Island resident and business owner was out of income for 9 months after Helene disrupted her home and business.

People First's Disaster Relief Reimbursement Program awarded **\$12,963** to help cover qualified expenses resulting from the storm.

"It was the best Christmas present ever," Evans said. "There were so many things that I had put on credit cards and things that I had make payments on for my business that I didn't have an income. So, what that money did for me was help me pay off that debt and really help me financially and took that burden off of me."
