Description & Comments

This item is a grant agreement between Pinellas County and Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) for Pinellas County Dune Restoration Project also known as Post Idalia Emergency Shore Stabilization, CIP project 006241A. Agreement 24PI1 will provide \$15,100,000 in grant funding for dune restoration design and construction costs. The agreement begins 9/1/2023 and expires 12/31/2026.

Post Idalia Emergency Shore Stabilization, 006241A, is included in the FY24-FY29 Capital Improvement Program, funded by Tourist Development Tax. The FY24 budget is \$21.0M. A budget amendment has been prepared and is planned to go before the Board of County Commissioners in December, Legistar File 23-1772A. This amendment will shift \$16.0M from Reserves-Future Years-Tourist Development-Beach Nourishment within the Capital Projects Fund 3001 to Post Idalia Emergency Shore Stabilization, CIP project 006241A, resulting in an amended FY24 budget of \$37.0M for project 006241A. The current total project estimate is \$36.0M

The FDEP grant requires an equal County match of \$15,100,000 of which there is sufficient budget for under the Post Idalia Emergency Shore Stabilization, 006241A. FDEP will provide payment to the County on a cost reimbursement basis for eligible contractual services expenditures upon completion, submittal and approval of grant work plan deliverables. Retainage may be held at FDEP's discretion at up to 10%.

- \$5,707,204 of the FDEP agreement funding is a federal pass through from the United States Treasury and categorized as State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF). Provisions of which are included in Attachment 8 of the Agreement.
- The grant award would reduce the County's funding contribution and does not increase the project cost.
