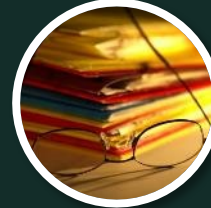

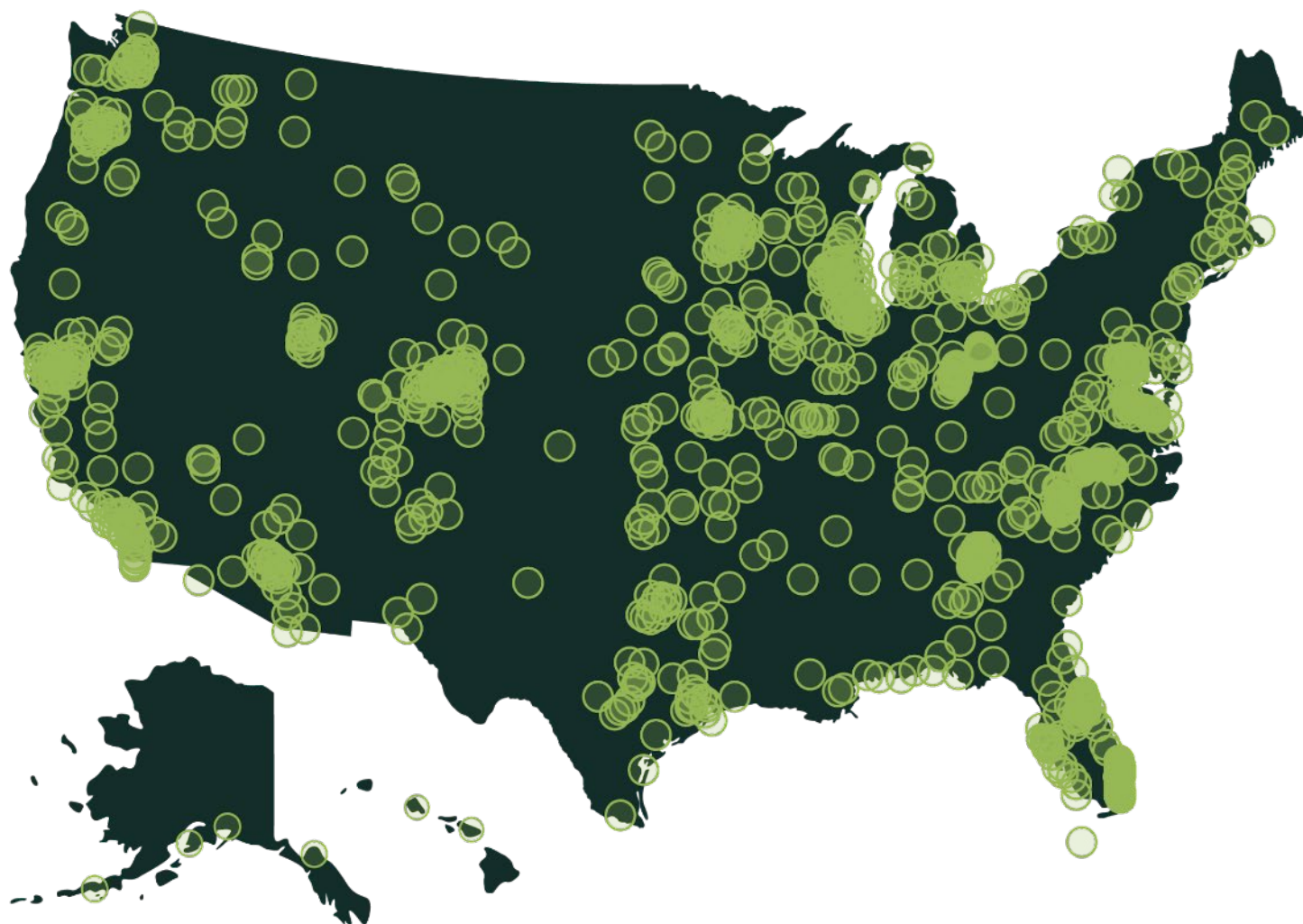
The National Community Survey™ in Pinellas County



The NCS™ for Pinellas County, FL

- Third time conducting The NCS (previous surveys in 2023, 2024)
- Survey conducted from February 27, 2025 – April 10, 2025
- Mailing approach employed:
 - Probability-based sample of 5,000 randomly selected households
 - 420 total responses received
 - 9% overall response rate
 - Non-probability, open-participation survey: 1,904 responses
- Results statistically weighted to reflect Pinellas County overall
- 95% confidence interval with a +/- 5% margin of error

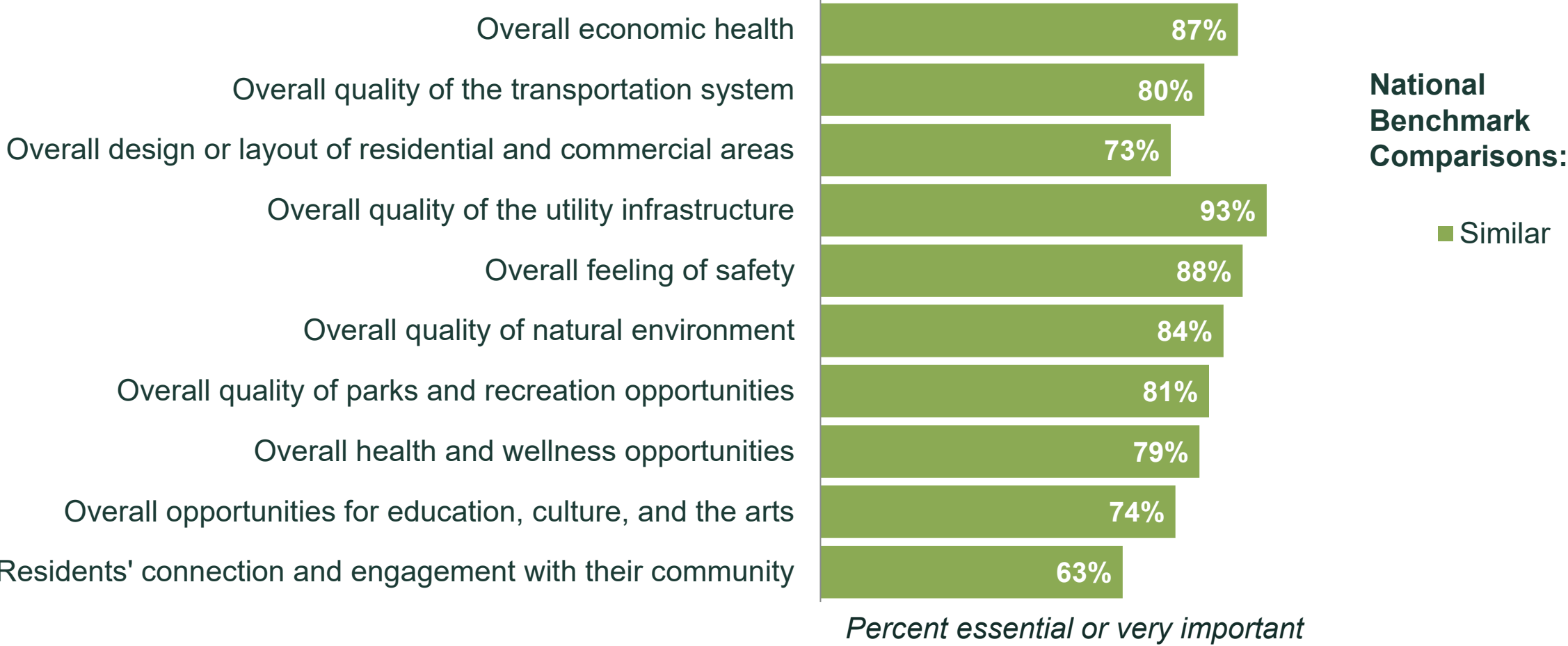

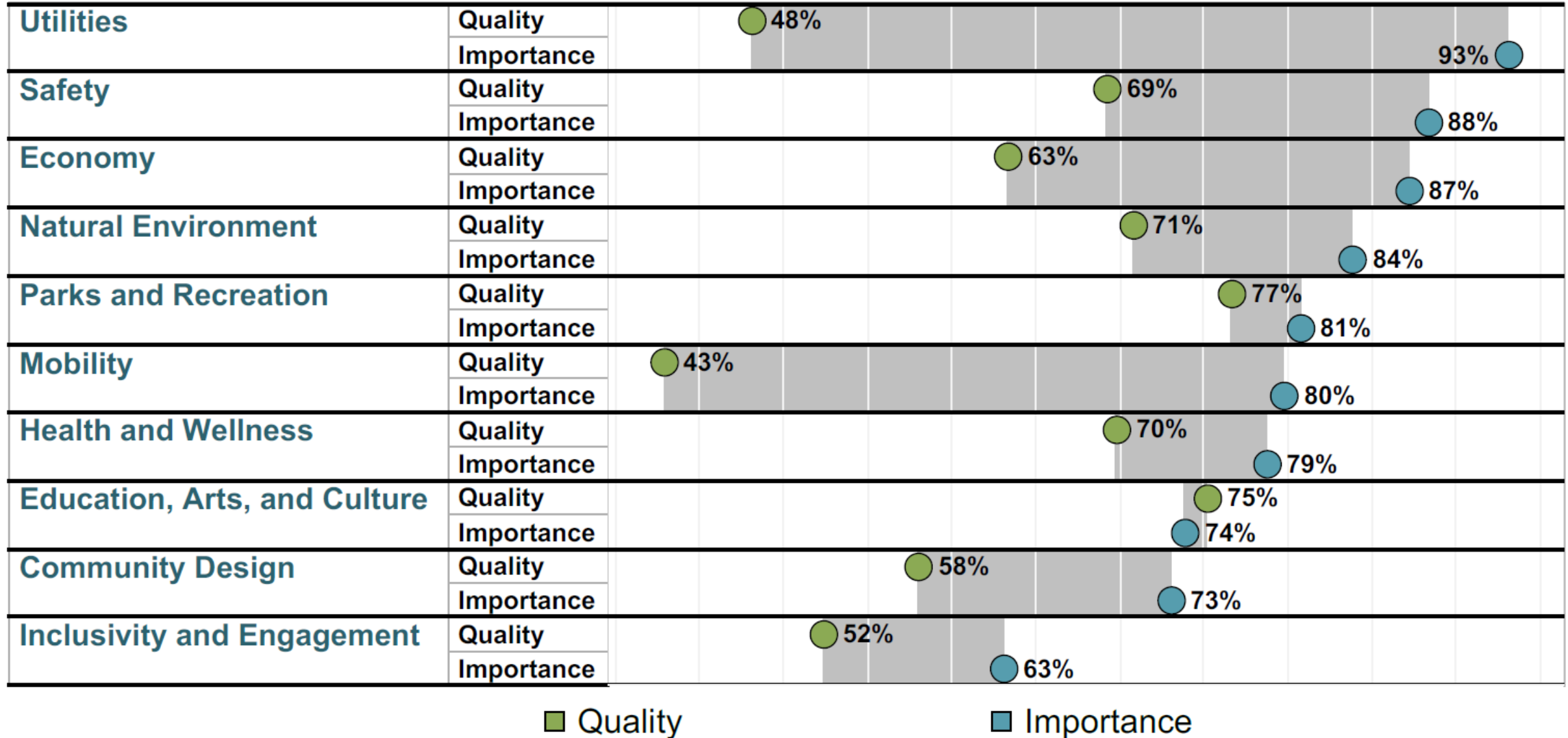
Facets of Community Livability: Quality

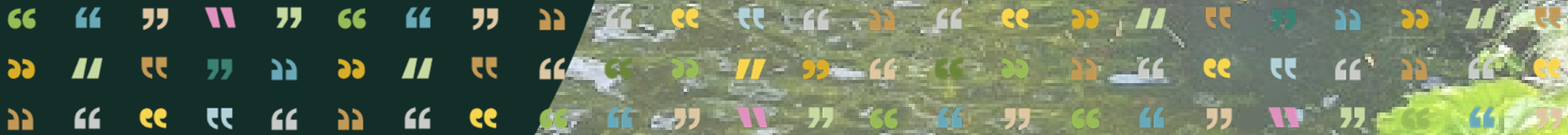

- The overall quality of life in Pinellas County (80%)

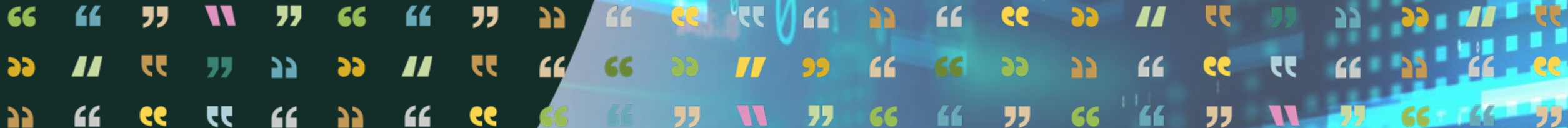

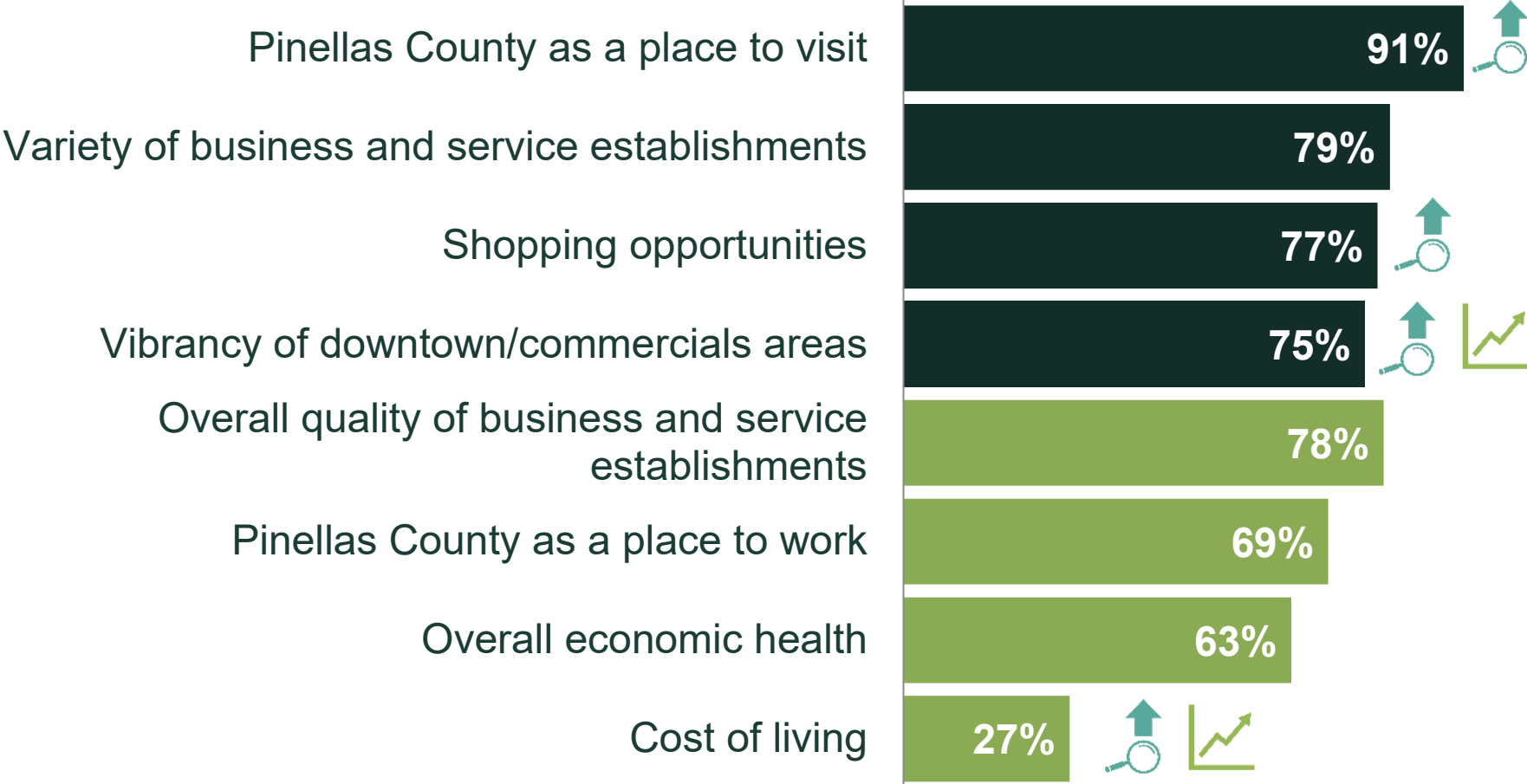

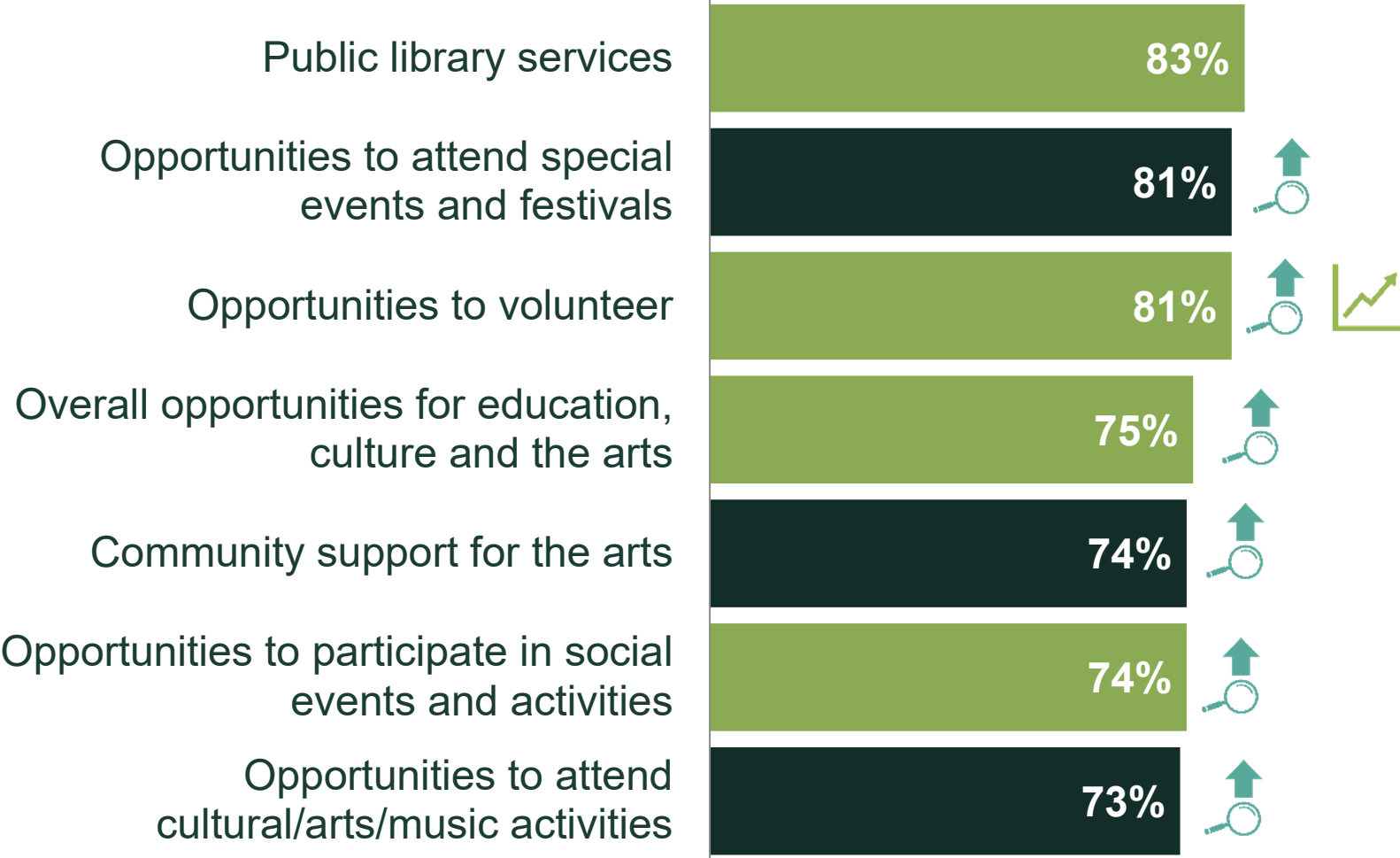


Education, Arts, and Culture in Pinellas County

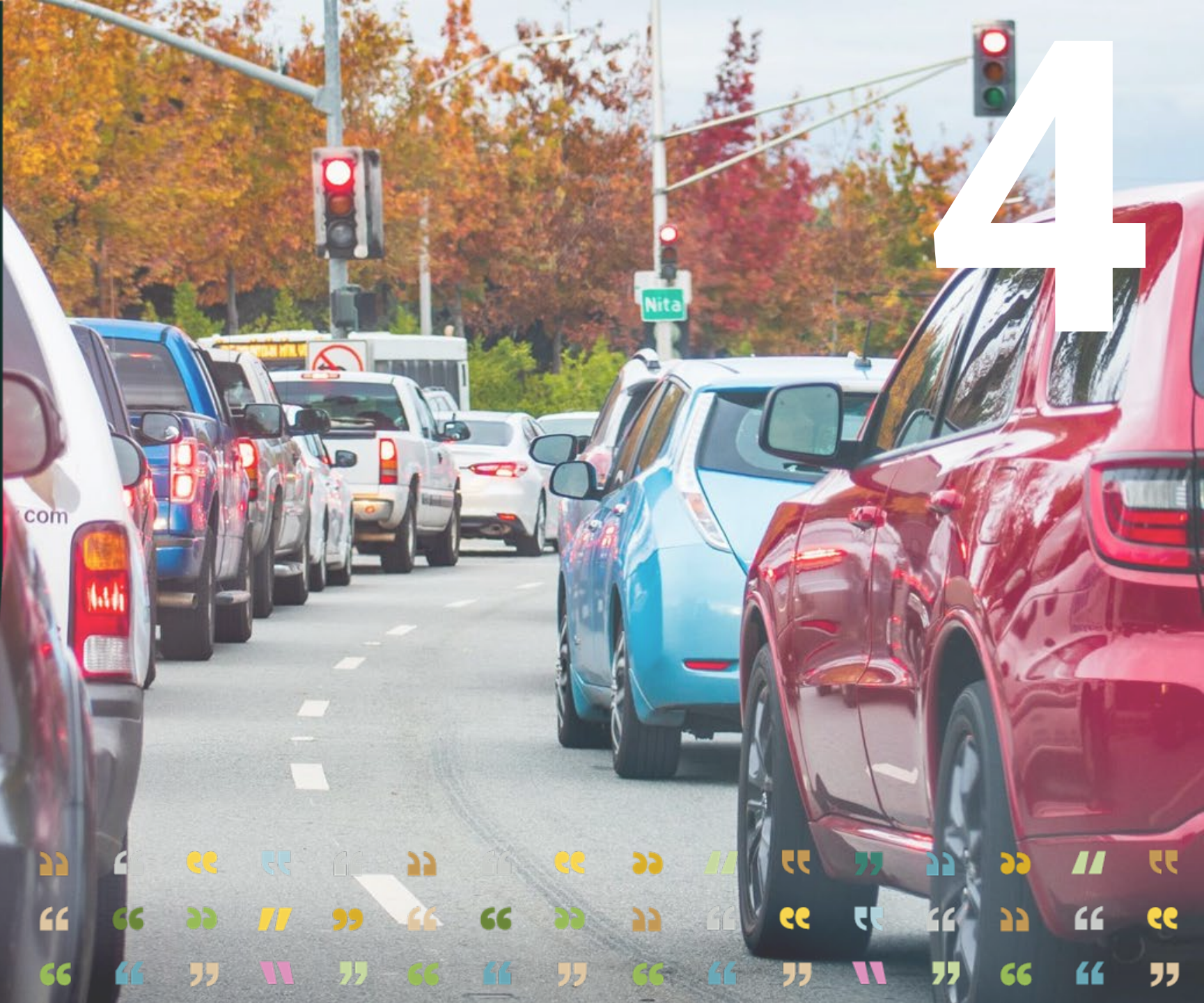

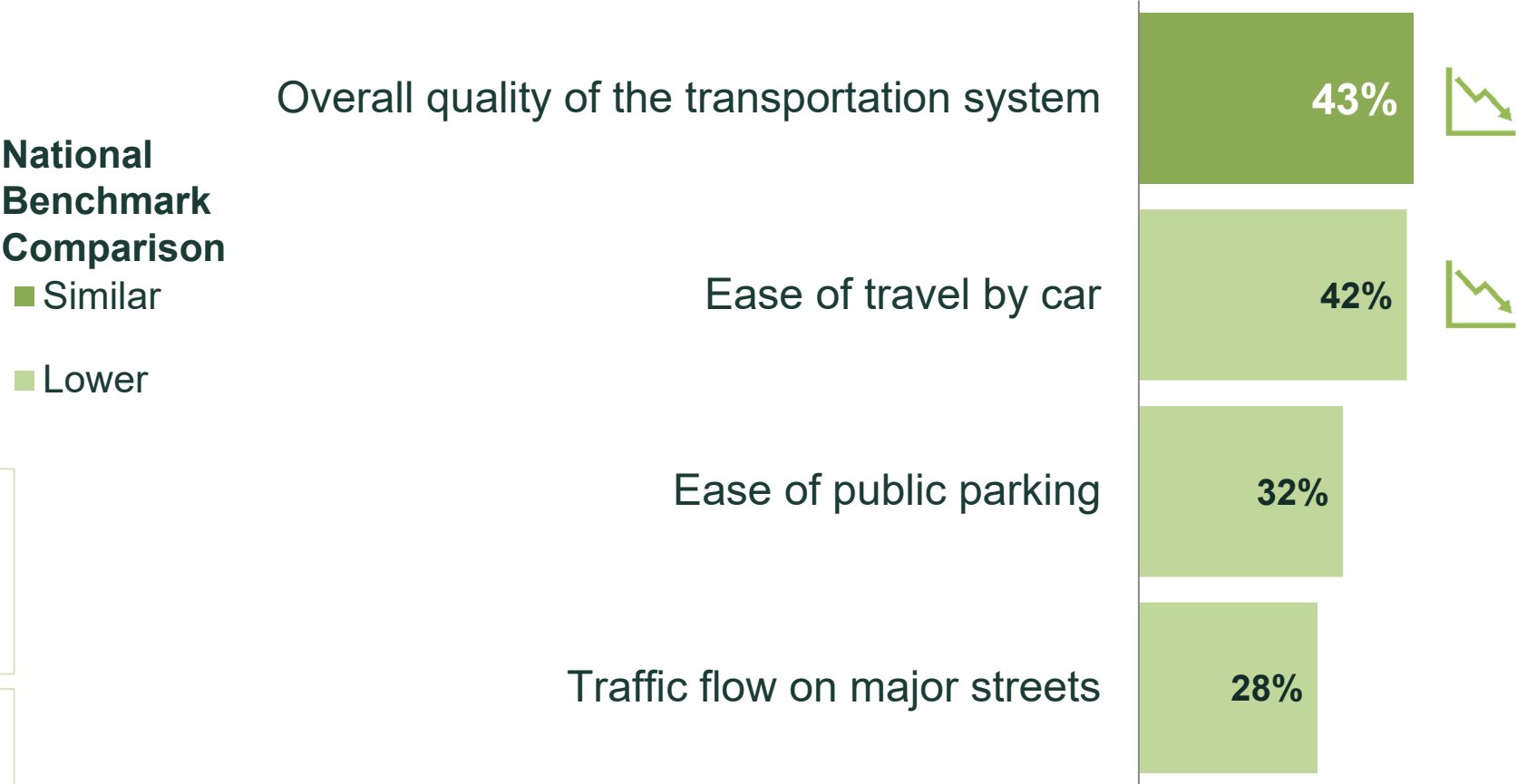

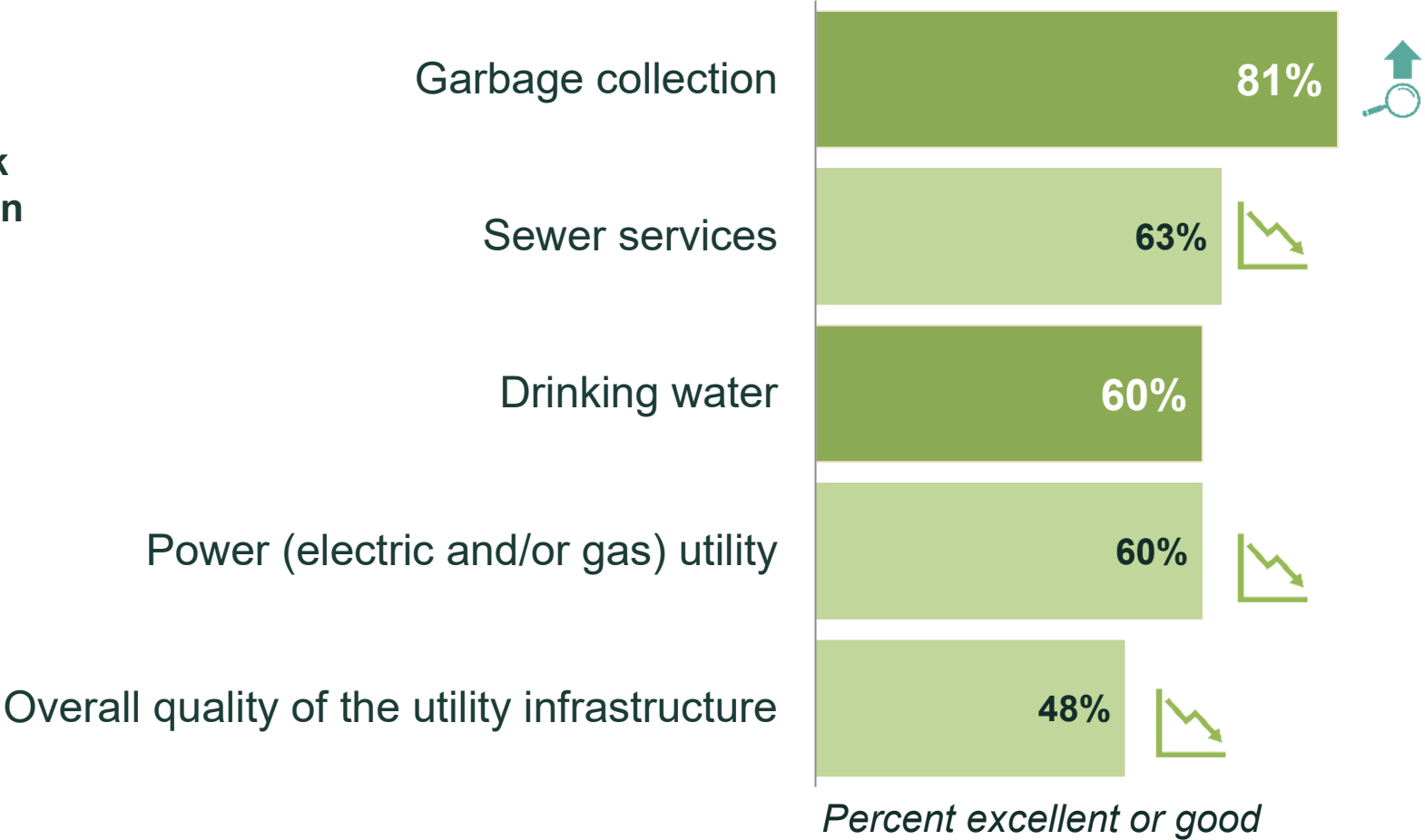

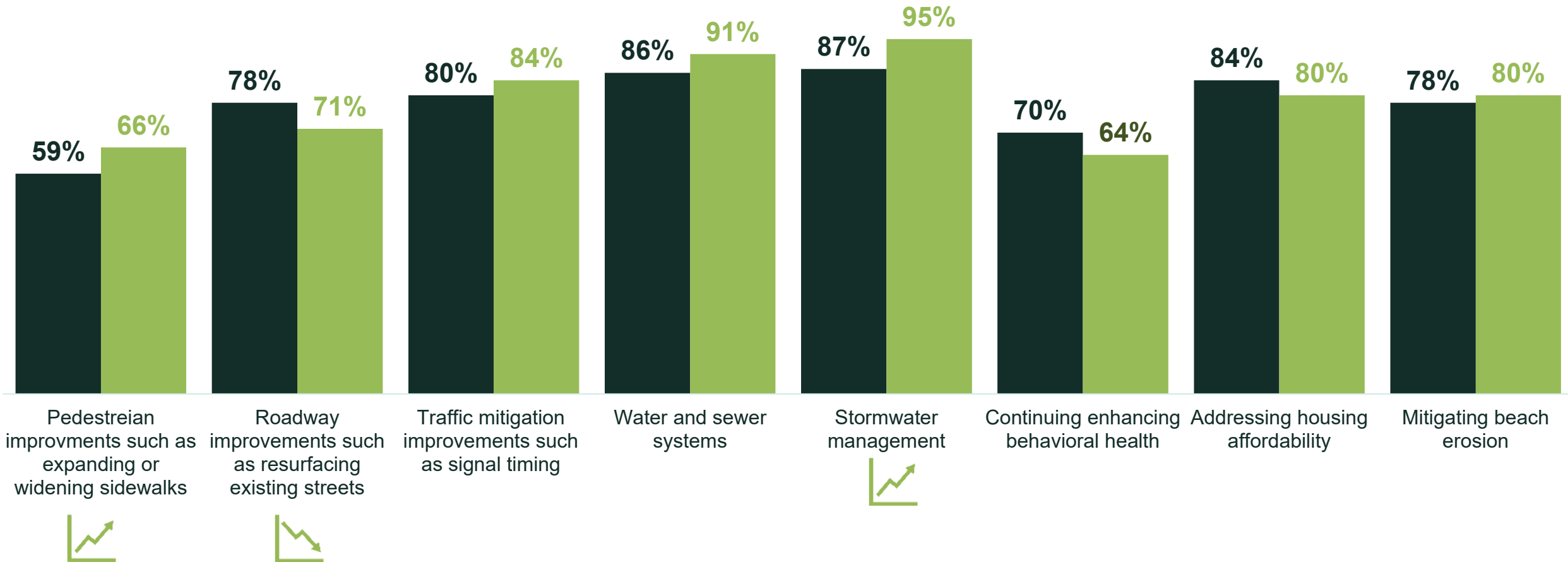
Pinellas County Potential Investments

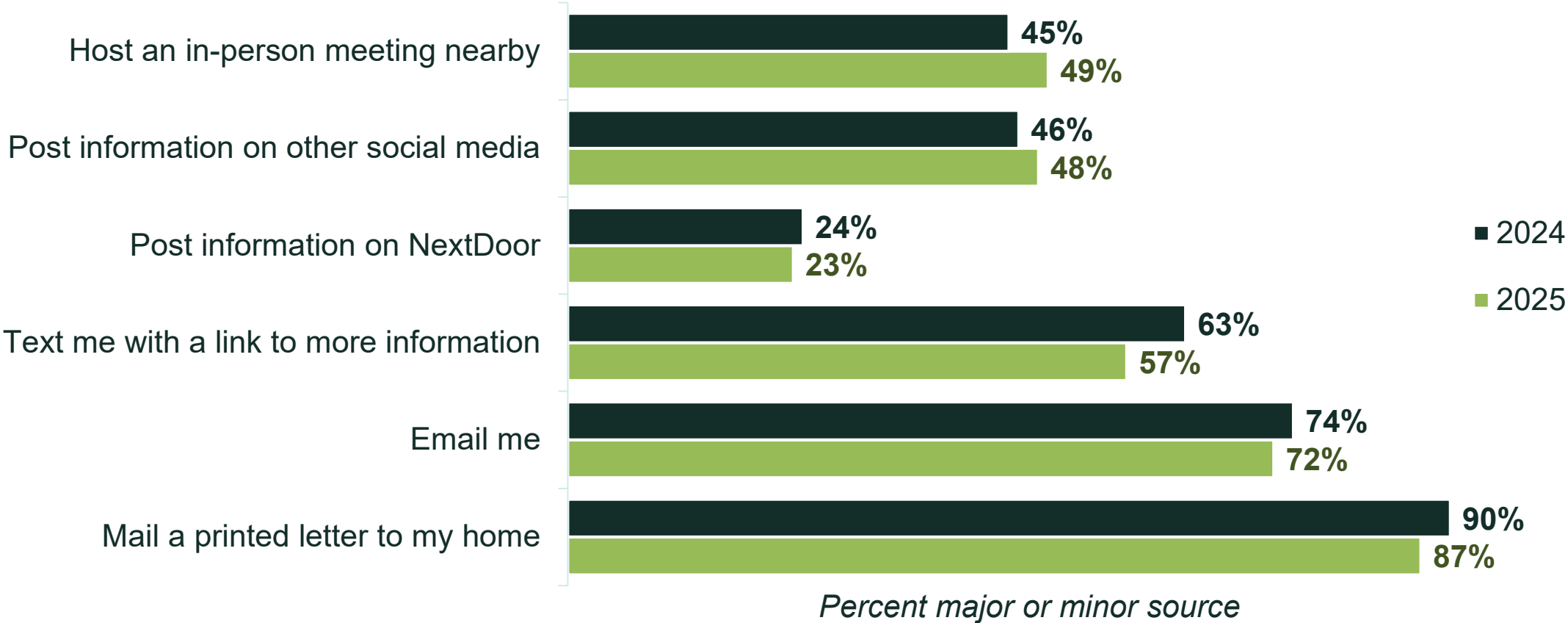

1. Residents continue to experience a high quality of life in Pinellas County.
