OMB has no objection to the department submitting a grant application to the US Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services to obtain funding for the Pinellas County Schools district to deploy technology to provide first responders and law enforcement interactive access to live information during an emergency event.

Requested funding is \$488,366 from the 2018 COPS Office STOP School Violence Prevention Program (SVPP) over a two year period. A 25% match is required, \$162,789. The Pinellas County Schools will provide the match through the School Board Capital Outlay Funds. The school district has indicated that FY18 match is budgeted. Total project cost is \$651,155.

School districts are only able to receive SVPP funding through a sub-award from the County.

The Department Director can sign off on this application package. Please include this email when you send a completed submittal through Granicus. The completed application will be a delegated item to be placed on the County Administrator's Delegated Authority log.

Proposed Abstract (Project Scope of Work):

The Pinellas School Violence Prevention Program (PSVPP) was designed to improve school security through evidence-based school safety interventions for: (1) coordination with local law enforcement, and (2) acquisition and installation of technology for expedited notification of local law enforcement during an emergency. The PSVPP is part of comprehensive school safety planning efforts in Pinellas. Pinellas will work with IntraLogic Solutions (ILS) to provide a centralized and automated lockdown system that provides first

responders and law enforcement interactive access to live information during the event of an active shooter or other emergency situation. During an active shooter or other lockdown emergency, the system can be activated from multiple initiation methods. Additionally, the district will deploy IntraLogic's Video Management Solution and PSIM solution, which enables first responders to access a live network of cameras and other resources.
