Proposed FY20 Budget Summary

- \$2,412,269,980 Total Budget
- 0.5% (\$13.2M) increase

- Operating increase \$51.2M (2.8%)
- General Fund increase \$24.7M (3.4%)
 - Reserves 16.5% (\$105.1M)
- Lowest debt per capita among urban Florida counties



Millage Rates

- No proposed increases for Countywide or MSTU
 - General Fund 5.2755 mills (unchanged since FY14)
 - EMS 0.9158 mills (unchanged since FY14)
 - Health Department 0.0835 mills (increased in FY18)
 - MSTU 2.0857 mills (unchanged since FY09)
- Proposed rollback rate for 7 Fire Districts; all others remain unchanged



BCC Departments

- \$1.5B Total Budget
 - 1.8% (\$28.4M) decrease
 - 63% of total budget
 - Operating \$1.1B (increase \$3.6M / 0.3%)
 - Governmental Services \$624.7M (decrease \$19.2M / 3.0%)
 - Enterprise Services \$435.5M (increase \$22.8M / 5.5%)
- Functions range from Airport to Solid Waste, Animal Services to EMS, Parks to Public Works



Constitutional Officers

- \$378.0M Total Budget
 - 1.8% (\$6.5M) increase
 - 16% of total budget
 - Operating \$371.4M (increase \$16.0M / 4.5%)
 - Majority (85%) is Sheriff \$315.6M
- Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller, Property Appraiser,
 Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, and Tax Collector



Other Agencies

- \$509.6M Total Budget
 - 7.4% (\$35.1M) increase
 - 21% of total budget
 - Operating \$476.6M (increase \$31.6M / 7.1%)
- Functions include Internal Service Funds (Business Technology Services, Risk Management), Human Resources, Court Support (Public Defender, State Attorney and Judiciary), and Unincorporated Area Fire Districts, Libraries, and Recreation



Staffing Levels

Total FY20 FTE – 5,413.7

- BCC Departments 2,208.3 (increase 25.5)
 - 3.0 net FTE increase
 - Remainder replacing contractors or temporary
- Constitutional Officers 2,962.7 (increase 31.5)
- Court Support 43.3 (increase 0.3)
- Independent Agencies 199.4 (increase 0.6)

JULY 23

County Administrator presents FY20 Proposed Budget

AUGUST 1

Budget Information Session – Feedback regarding FY20 Proposed Budget and discussion to finalize maximum millage rates for inclusion in TRIM notices

AUGUST 2

Property Appraiser notified of maximum millage rates for development of TRIM notices

AUGUST 20

TRIM notices mailed to all property owners

SEPTEMBER 10

Tentative FY20 Budget posted to County website

SEPTEMBER 12

1st Public Hearing – BCC adopts tentative FY20 millage rates and budgets

SEPTEMBER 24


2nd Public Hearing – BCC adopts final FY20 millage rates and budgets
