

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY
AND
CITY OF TARPON SPRINGS, FLORIDA
FOR CERTAIN ACTIVITIES REQUIRED PRIOR TO
FUTURE MAINTENANCE DREDGING AT
ANCLOTE RIVER, FLORIDA PROJECT

This MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (hereinafter this "MOA") is entered into this 10th day of July, 2020, by and between the Department of the Army (hereinafter the "Government"), represented by the District Commander for the Jacksonville District (hereinafter the "District Commander"), and the City of Tarpon Springs, Florida (hereinafter the "Contributor"), represented by its Mayor.

WITNESSETH, THAT:

WHEREAS, the Government is authorized to operate and maintain the Anclote River, Florida Project (hereinafter the "Project") pursuant to the River and Harbor Act of 1899, as modified by the River and Harbor Act of 1927 (Public Law 69-560), River and Harbor Act of 1935 (Public Law 74-409), and River and Harbor Act of 1945 (Public Law 79-14);

WHEREAS, limited Federal funding is available for certain activities to be undertaken prior to any future maintenance dredging of the Project;

WHEREAS, the Contributor considers it to be in its own interest to contribute funds voluntarily to be used by the Government to perform engineering and planning activities, geotechnical and environmental surveys, and preparation for dredging required prior to any future maintenance dredging of the Project (hereinafter "Contributed Funds Work"); and

WHEREAS, the Government is authorized pursuant to 33 U.S.C. 701h to receive and expend funds to be used for Contributed Funds Work.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Government and Contributor agree as follows:

1. The Contributor plans to provide to the Government funds up to a total of \$300,000 to pay costs associated with the Contributed Funds Work, including the costs of labor, to be undertaken under this MOA.
2. The Contributor shall provide funds in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph.

 - a. Within thirty (30) calendar days of the execution of this MOA, the Contributor shall provide to the Government \$300,000, which is the currently estimated cost of Contributed Funds

Work to be performed during the remainder of the current fiscal year of the Government. The Government and Contributor shall develop expeditiously a Work Plan for Contributed Funds Work proposed to be performed during the remainder of the fiscal year, including schedules and estimated costs. Both parties will confer before any substantive changes are made to the Work Plan.

b. No later than thirty (30) calendar days before the beginning of each full fiscal year of the Government covered by this MOA, the Government and Contributor shall develop a Work Plan for Contributed Funds Work proposed to be performed during the upcoming fiscal year. The Work Plan shall identify the amount of funds the Contributor plans to provide; the schedule and estimated costs for completion of Contributed Funds Work; and the Government's estimate of funds required for each quarter. No later than thirty (30) calendar days before the beginning of each quarter of the fiscal year, the Contributor shall provide to the Government funds for all estimated costs of Contributed Funds Work to be accomplished in that quarter. The Government and Contributor shall review and update, as necessary, the Work Plan. Both parties will confer before any substantive changes are made to the Work Plan.

c. If at any time the Government determines that additional funds are needed, the Government shall notify the Contributor in writing of the amount needed and no later than thirty (30) calendar days from receipt of such notice, the Contributor shall provide to the Government the full amount of the additional funds needed, except that the total amount of funds provided by the Contributor for Contributed Funds Work under this MOA shall not exceed \$300,000.

3. The Contributor shall provide the funds to the Government by delivering a check payable to "FAO, USAED Jacksonville (K3)" to the District Commander or providing an Electronic Funds Transfer of such funds in accordance with procedures established by the Government.

4. The Government shall provide the Contributor with quarterly reports of obligations for the Contributed Funds Work. The first such report shall be provided within thirty (30) calendar days after the final day of the first full quarter of the Government fiscal year following initial receipt of funds pursuant to this MOA. Subsequent reports shall be provided within thirty (30) calendar days after the final day of each succeeding quarter until the Government concludes all Contributed Funds Work under this MOA.

5. Upon completion of Contributed Funds Work under this MOA, the Government shall conduct a final accounting of the costs of such Contributed Funds Work and furnish the Contributor with written notice of the results of such final accounting. If the costs of the Contributed Funds Work exceed the amount of funds provided by the Contributor, the Contributor shall provide the required additional funds within thirty (30) calendar days of such written notice by delivering a check payable to "FAO, USAED Jacksonville (K3)" to the District Commander or providing an Electronic Funds Transfer of such funds in accordance with procedures established by the Government, except that the total amount of funds provided by the Contributor for Contributed Funds Work under this MOA shall not exceed \$300,000. If any funds provided by the Contributor were not obligated for the Contributed Funds Work, the Government shall refund those funds to the Contributor within thirty (30) calendar days of completion of the final accounting.

6. No credit or repayment is authorized, nor shall be provided, for any funds provided by the Contributor and obligated by the Government for the Contributed Funds Work.

7. Nothing herein shall constitute, represent, or imply any commitment to budget or appropriate funds for maintenance dredging of the Project in the future; and nothing herein shall represent, or give rise to, obligations of the United States.

8. The Contributor shall hold and save the Government free from all damages arising from the Contributed Funds Work, except for damages due to the fault or negligence of the Government or its contractors.

9. In the exercise of their respective rights and obligations under this MOA, the Government and the Contributor each act in an independent capacity, and neither is to be considered the officer, agent, or employee of the other.

10. Notices.

a. Any notice, request, demand, or other communication required or permitted to be given under this MOA shall be deemed to have been duly given if in writing and delivered personally or mailed by registered or certified mail, with return receipt, as follows:

b. A party may change the recipient or address to which such communications are to be directed by giving written notice to the other party in the manner provided in this paragraph.


11. This MOA may be modified or amended only by written, mutual agreement of the parties.



CERTIFICATION REGARDING LOBBYING


The undersigned certifies, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief that:

(1) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

(2) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

(3) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including subcontracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.
