Benefit Summary (How will this benefit the County, Dept, etc?):

This program will afford Pinellas County the opportunity to provide outreach efforts to mitigate the number of overdose deaths. From 2015 to 2018, the number of opioid related accidental fatalities increased by 76.3% (135 to 238), while Pinellas' population increased only 2.7% during the same period. The preliminary figures for 2019 show opioid overdose deaths continue to increase over previous years. Through education and harm reduction strategies, the program will seek to encourage individuals in the overdose "hot spot" areas to be provided with access to Naloxone and educated regarding signs of an overdose and how to connect to substance use disorder treatment.
