A RESOLUTION OF THE PINELLAS COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SUPPORTING THE STATE OF FLORIDA'S HONORARY DESIGNATION OF U.S. 92/S.R. 600/GANDY BOULEVARD BETWEEN S. WHEREAS, James A. Sebesta and his family moved to St. Petersburg, Florida in 1984;

**WHEREAS,** James A. Sebesta was active in the 1999 reopening of the former Gandy Bridge as the Friendship Trail Bridge for pedestrians and bicyclists;

WHEREAS, James A. Sebesta served as a Republican member of the Florida Senate from 1998 to 2006 and was focused on planning for Florida's growth as Chairman of the Senate Transportation Committee with a desire to make traveling in Florida safer;

**WHEREAS,** Florida Legislature passed a law during the 2025 Florida Legislative Session, effective July 1, 2025, designating the portion of U.S. 92/S.R. 600/Gandy Boulevard between S. West Shore Boulevard in Hillsborough County and 4th Street N. in Pinellas County is designated as "Senator James A. Sebesta Memorial Highway";

WHEREAS, Section 334.071(3), Florida Statutes requires that the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners adopt a resolution supporting the designation of the "Senator James A. Sebesta Memorial Highway" before any markers identifying same are placed; and
