RE: ARPA Nonprofit Capital Project Fund – Round 1 Large Projects Committee Recommendations

The Pinellas ARPA Nonprofit Capital Project Fund Large Projects Committee met on March 7 to review applications and make recommendations for funding. The meeting minutes and a recording of the meeting will be available shortly at https://pinellascf.org/grants/arpa/arpa-nonprofit-capital-project-fund/docs/.

PCF is aware that members of the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners may begin receiving phone calls or inquiries about funding. **For quick reference, we've attached the funding recommendations.**

In addition, here are key points about this funding:

- 1. Round 1, Large Capital Projects began with a letter of intent process in which 78 organizations submitted projects for consideration.
- 2. Based on the strength of the letters of intent, 23 organizations were invited to submit a full application for funding consideration.
- 3. 19 organizations ultimately submitted a full application. The project requests totaled \$22,517,891.00. In this round, \$10.5 million is available for awarding to projects.
- 4. Full project applications are available to review at the link at the beginning of this memo.
- 5. 87% of the project recommendations are from organizations providing services in priority funding areas as discussed with commissioners: individuals with disabilities, food security, specialized healthcare (mental health, dental care, substance use), and housing.

During their deliberations, committee members prioritized projects that would reach the most people in Pinellas County. The committee prioritized projects that will have a tremendous impact on residents by expanding access to food, housing, education, and healthcare.

Soon, one-on-one meetings will be scheduled with each commissioner. Additionally, PCF will attend the April 6 Commission work session and the April 11 Commission meeting. We will be prepared to answer any questions that may arise as you consider these recommendations.
