## Ridgecrest Community Plan 2021



Pinellas County partnered with community stakeholders in 1994 to create an action plan for community development and planning in Greater Ridgecrest. In 2015, Pinellas County led another community engagement process to determine the needs and priorities of the community. From these efforts the Greater Ridgecrest Neighborhood Revitalization Vision was created. The Vision included goals, strategies, and priority projects.

In 2021, the County worked with the Friends of Ridgecrest to review these documents. The Friends of Ridgecrest is the lead community group made up of volunteers and representatives from community service providers in the area. The County and the Friends determined what priorities had been accomplished, what was no longer relevant, and what additional needs exist in the community today. Together, they produced this updated

# **High Point** Community Plan 2021



In 2021, Pinellas County formed a community advisory group to create a plan to guide improvements to the High Point neighborhood.
