NOTES: Each year, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awards health centers with one-time supplemental grant funding based on quality improvement measures reported from the 2016 and 2017 Uniform Data System (UDS) performance reports.

Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners was awarded \$122,348.00 in FY 2018 for its quality improvement efforts including its Patient Centered Medical Home Recognition. The award provides one-time funding for use during the period of August 1, 2018, through July 31, 2019. Funds must be used to support quality improvement activities which include, but are not limited to: developing and improving health center QI systems and infrastructure, including training staff, developing policies and procedures, enhancing health information technology, certified electronic health record, and data systems, data analysis; and/or developing and improving care delivery systems, including care coordination, case management, medication management, laboratory reporting and tracking, training and workflow redesign to support team-based care, clinical integration of behavioral health, oral health, HIV care, and other services; and/or patient engagement activities.

The County will be working closely with the Florida Department of Health in Pinellas and the County's Business Technology Services Department to enhance our electronic health record capabilities, maintaining our PCMH recognition, and provide additional training to clinical staff.
