This is for approval of the ranking of firms and agreement with the number one ranked firm EutroPHIX for Joe's Creek Stream Restoration Utilizing Phosphorus Mitigation and Realtime Variable Rate Injection and Monitoring Systems. This contract is 100% grant reimbursed by the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Urban Stream Restoration Utilizing Phosphorus Mitigation and Realtime Variable Rate Injection and Monitoring Systems Grant. Pinellas County entered into a Grant Agreement with State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection on June 17, 2025, and received \$901,840.00 for this work and is for a period of 880 calendar days.

Revenue of \$901,840 for this contract is being received through the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Urban Stream Restoration Utilizing Phosphorus Mitigation and Realtime Variable Rate Injection and Monitoring Systems Grant. Revenue funding for these agreements is not included in the current-year budget Public Works Surface Water Utility Fund. Work is not expected to commence until late FY26, and a budget amendment to recognize the revenue may be requested if needed at that time.

Expenditure funding for these agreements is included in the current-year budget of Public Works in the Surface Water Utility Fund.
