Dear Commissioner Scott,

It is with great concern that I have learned of the Pinellas County Commission's consideration to eliminate funding for Creative Pinellas.

For more than a decade, I have worked with Creative Pinellas both directly and indirectly. Six of those years I served as Associate Director of the St. Petersburg Arts Alliance with John Collins. In many funding opportunities, we relied on Creative Pinellas as the official Local Arts Agency for the County. Throughout its history, Creative Pinellas has provided leadership to the arts community, helping to create Pinellas County as a serious arts destination.

The County Statute 265.32 "County Fine Arts Council" clearly outlines the responsibilities of such an agency. These include:

- (a) Stimulating greater governmental and public awareness and appreciation of the importance of the arts to the people of Florida.
- (b) Encouraging and facilitating greater and more efficient use of governmental and private resources for the development and support of the arts.
- (c) Encouraging and facilitating opportunities for Florida residents to participate in artistic activities.
- (d) Promoting the development of Florida artists, arts institutions, community organizations sponsoring arts activities, and audiences.

- (e) Surveying and assessing the needs of the arts, artists, arts institutions, community organizations sponsoring arts activities, and people of this state relating to the arts.
- (f) Supporting and facilitating the preservation and growth of the state's artistic resources.
- (g) Contracting for artistic services, performances, and exhibits.
- (h) Developing a center or complex of physical facilities for the use of the arts.
- (i) Providing financial and technical assistance to artists, arts institutions, and audiences.
- (j) Otherwise serving the citizens of the county and state in the realm of the arts.

Creative Pinellas has lived up to its responsibilities to the County in numerous ways including:

- Maintaining the Gallery (a Pinellas Parks Department property), with a current \$200,000 privately funded upgrade underway
- Partnering with the County on Graffiti Abatement through murals and signal box projects
- Opening and managing the art gallery at PIE Airport and its art collection (funded by the airport)
- Securing a 5 year contract with the Lealman CRA with annual deliverables
- Partnering with Pinellas County Schools on Youth Art Month, middle school and high school exhibitions, with plans for further expansion..
- Completing an inventory of the County's public art collection.
- Partnering with VSPC to showcase local artists at national events such as the Piedmont Park Fine Arts Festival and regional IPW travel show.

Recognizing the economic importance of tourism, Creative Pinellas has also shifted to strengthen its alignment with visitor engagement:

- Hiring a Curatorial Director with arts and tourism marketing expertise.
- Bringing on as Managing Editor of Arts Coast Magazine, a former Tampa Bay Times writer and contributor to VSPC's Gulf to Bay destination magazine, with a focus on long-range calendars, artist spotlights and visitor-centered stories.
- Recruiting VSPC Kylie Kiaz as a grants panelist to enhance tourism partnerships
- Refocusing Individual Artist Grants into "Making Waves", a program with strong tourism connections.

The arts contribute significantly to our local economy and to our community vitality. Visitors are essential, but so is a strong cultural fabric that makes Pinellas County an inspiring place to live, work, and create. Creative Pinellas is indispensable to both goals.

I strongly urge you to reconsider any proposal to defund Creative Pinellas. The organization has proven its ability to deliver a strong return on investment for the County, adapt to evolving priorities, and foster the kind of cultural excellence that makes Pinellas thrive.

Hello Mr. Scott,

It has come to my attention that the organization Creative Pinellas is at risk of being defunded. Therefore, I wanted to take a minute to express the great concern this brings not only me but the arts community here in Pinellas County. While I have never personally received one of their art grants, I have continually had the opportunity to apply and be considered. One artist, Jennifer Chandley, received one of these grants a couple of years ago and I got to attend an artist talk where she went in depth about how her art was a vessel of healing through her life experiences.

Being a part of the community here in pinellas county, even outside of being an artist, I feel that art beautifies our community to a great degree. It helps unify us, when one artist starts a conversation through their work or about their work, it opens up the opportunity for the rest of us to weigh in. This connection is something I find unique to the arts, it's almost like both an icebreaker and something tangible that serves to deepen one anothers connection. Often, art or the meaning of art is not something singularly understood; For example, the artist Jennifer Chandley opened up about her personal life, but that just brought more people into the conversation about their own personal lives. In addition, the

interpretation of our feelings has a range far beyond one person's definition of a particular subject or realm of focus.

While some people may hold the opinion that feelings and art are insignificant in the larger scope of things, on the contrary, it is a navigational tool built on inclusivity. Even just thinking of our history, when we think of centuries ago, it feels so separate from our today. But art is a written record that shows our innate human sensibilities evolving through time, bridging the past to the present, and posing the question of what our future has in store. That implores you and the other commissioners to envision what our community's future has in store: Will we be a community that ignores the humanistic need to connect and evolve through art by defunding our arts organizations, or will we uplift the voices that serve to educate, inform, and further develop our culture?

As one of your constituents, I am appalled that the commission is considering defunding Creative Pinellas, our countywide arts agency.

Pinellas County is well-known for its arts, and an essential part of that is having a healthy arts agency. Defunding the County's arts agency would minimize the importance of cultural tourism in our area just as Creative Pinellas has been further providing a vibrant arts environment for our visitors. Defunding Creative Pinellas would also hurt hundreds of small businesses, educators, and nonprofits that rely on arts-related spending. The nonprofit arts and culture sector in Pinellas County supports almost five-thousand jobs. Defunding would result in lost economic momentum and could undermine millions in public and private investments already made.

As an active Artist, I know that the Arts drive tourism and revenue to local businesses. Did you know that Cultural tourism in Pinellas County generates \$350 million annually through ticket sales, lodging, food, and other local spending, directly tied to organizations like Creative Pinellas? For every \$1 invested in the arts, communities see a \$7–\$9 return through local spending and economic activity. The 4.1 million annual attendees at Pinellas County's nonprofit arts and culture events spend an average of almost \$36 per person, per event, beyond the cost of admission – on items such as meals, parking, and lodging. 34% of the attendees live outside of

Pinellas County; they average about \$46 in event-related spending per person per event. Arts tourists are ideal visitors, staying longer and spending more than non-Arts tourists.

The arts is what make our community unique. I don't want to live in a cookie-cutter corporate town that looks like any other. They've been instrumental in the development of the murals around town, which give our town so much character.

My property taxes are not going down, only up, and so are everyone else's. The county has the funds to continue Creative Pinellas. This proposal is short-sighted deinvestment in a vital part of our community. Don't do it, Christa Fairbrother

Dear Commissioners, I am writing to share what Creative Pinellas has meant to me personally, as both a lifelong resident and an emerging artist in Pinellas County. Murals along the Pinellas Trail, at Belcher and Alderman Roads in Palm Harbor, and the signal box projects are all examples of how Creative Pinellas has made our community more beautiful and inspiring. These projects support tourism by turning our public spaces into cultural landmarks. Last year, I received an Ignite grant from Creative Pinellas. While the grant itself was small (\$500), the impact was immense. I used the funds to build a public zine stand at the Palm Harbor Library, which now features over 200 zines from nearly 100 different artists. Zines are small, self-published works that provide raw and honest perspectives from people of all backgrounds. This project is especially meaningful because very few libraries across the country have public zine collections, making it a unique cultural feature that both residents and visitors can enjoy. Zines capture the voices of a community —offering a cultural record of ideas, stories, and creativity that is diverse, unfiltered, and accessible. Visitors who encounter this collection not only discover something unexpected and memorable, but also gain insight into the cultural life of Pinellas County. This is just one example of how Creative Pinellas empowers residents to make a difference in their own communities. What Commissioner Scott described as "grant programs that they're giving money for artists to buy easels and cameras and things like that. And it's not going to tourism at all." doesn't capture the full story. These grants are not handouts—they are investments that yield real cultural, educational, and economic returns for the county. Creative Pinellas actively engages with tourism, directly addressing one of the main concerns

raised about continuing their funding. They recently debuted a new art gallery, Sightline, at St. Pete-Clearwater International Airport (PIE), designed to connect travelers with the vibrant arts community of Pinellas County. Their upcoming Making Waves program is another strong example of how Creative Pinellas promotes cultural tourism. In April–May 2026, Making Waves will bring together our vibrant cultural community through a series of exhibitions, performances, and arts experiences that highlight the natural beauty of our county. This series of events invites visitors to not only vacation here, but to be immersed in the creativity and culture of Pinellas County. Myself and many other artists already applied for this grant — by cutting funding for Creative Pinellas, you're discarding fully developed projects that artists have spent weeks putting together. This is an organization with proven momentum, and taking that away without a stronger alternative in place would be a huge loss for both artists and the community. Defunding Creative Pinellas would mean losing not just support for artists, but a vital force that enriches our neighborhoods, supports local businesses through cultural tourism, and strengthens Pinellas County's identity as a vibrant, creative place to live and visit. I urge you to continue funding Creative Pinellas, not just for the benefit of artists like me, but for the benefit of our entire community and the many visitors who come here to experience something special. Message Greetings to the Pinellas County BOCC —

I am a past, two-term, county-appointed director on the PHCSA board (2013-2017) and am currently serving my second term on the Dunedin Fine Art Center board of directors. I am also a long-time member of the faculty there as the head of DFAC's printmaking program and studio.

My contractor husband and I have lived in Pinellas County since 1983 and my entire professional life as an artist was spent here in Pinellas. I was a designer and art director in advertising and magazine publishing; a storyboard artist in

the feature film business in FL and in television news as a senior broadcast designer. I am well aware of the importance of the arts as a driver of creative industry in this area, and after leaving corporate work at FOX13 in 1998, I started teaching at USF and DFAC.

Teaching is the thing I have enjoyed most in the latter part of my art career, and in 2017 and 2018, I was asked to formally serve as a mentor to two artists in Creative Pinellas's Emerging Artist Grant Program. This program pairs artists either starting their careers or moving them into a more professional phase later in their lives with experienced, well-connected working professionals like myself.

BOCC that CP's grant programs are just "giving money for artists to buy easels and cameras and things like that." This shows a clear misunderstanding about what professional practice mentorships do and what CP's grant program is for, which is career advancement. The candidates are all fully vetted; only a few in each year's class makes the cut. The program requires a detailed plan and strict goal benchmarks leading up to the annual exhibit and beyond, including what they're going to use the grant money for — and why.

Both of my mentees excelled in the program. One of them, for example: Brandie D., is an accomplished printmaker, photographer and former student of mine. She is a Coast Guard veteran and a former Florida State Park ranger. She successfully completed the program under my mentorship, using her grant money to purchase a 19" Richeson etching press that would've been out of reach on her modest state salary. She used the press and goals made with the mentorship to create, illustrate and enhance programs as a regional director of volunteer services in both the Florida State Park system and later in the Florida Trail Association. She is especially interested in veteran's programs that use

wilderness as a means of coping with PTSD and so she was one of the three veterans profiled in and selected for the video journey on Florida's waterways and trails in the 2024 documentary shown on WEDU, "O2O: Path To Connection". Her printmaking skills and that etching press were used in the making of the graphics and animation for the film. She has just started grad school in her midthirties, working on her printmaking MFA in order to begin teaching and to continue working with veterans in this next phase of her life. I wrote one of her letters of recommendation and I continue to stay in contact, advising her and critiquing her work in her studies.

what Creative Pinellas offers when I was a UF graduate, right out of school, trying to cobble together a career in illustration and graphic design in Pinellas County in the 1980s during a recession. I didn't know anyone here and didn't know how to connect with anyone in my field.

Let me address another criticism made of Creative Pinellas, that its funding is supposed to drive tourism. That's just one aspect of its programs and value to Pinellas. Retaining CP is also a quality-of-life issue. Are the county's wonderful parks and beaches also being forced to monetize or are they meant to be enjoyed as part of the county's attractiveness to residents?

Pinellas County is known as an arts destination. We have excellent performing arts theaters. We have a symphony. We have a collection of superb, world-class art museums, attracting national and international visitors, but none would exist unless they were supported by full and part time county resident memberships. They know their demographic or they wouldn't have built them here. DFAC is one of the largest community art centers in the country, with top-notch faculty, studios and programs, but we would not exist without the interest by the local community. The arts are an attractor for permanent and

seasonal residence in this county by the affluent and non-affluent alike, supporting our year-round tax base.

Pinellas County is known as a beach and sports tourism destination. The parks are visited by tourists, of course, but they are mainly used year-round by locals. Tourists come here for the beaches, but so do our residents in choosing to move and raise their families and stay here. Recreation is an attractor for permanent and seasonal residence in this county by the affluent and non-affluent alike, supporting our year-round tax base.

The arts, like our beaches, boating, parks and sports are what make Pinellas County not only a great place for tourists, but most especially for us: residents and their families.

Personally, beaches and baseball are not my jam, but the arts and sailing definitely are and both have kept me here long after I expected to leave after the end of my professional corporate design career and my husband's retirement from construction management.

know our arts donors in this county, and so do you. There's a lot of overlap.

Creative Pinellas isn't a club for hobbyists handing out taxpayer money for art supplies; it's a serious organization wholly interconnected with artists, programs, schools, museums and other institutions throughout the entire community. Creative Pinellas is helping them to adapt to a creative job field in flux. Not only for the artists hitting career headwinds now, but for future working professionals and educators later.

Respectfully, I hope you will all consider the impact of what losing Creative Pinellas would mean for them.

First of all, I would like to thank you for your service to our community. I am a volunteer and Gallery Host at Creative Pinellas. IF YOU HAVEN'T BEEN TO THE GALLERY, LET ME KNOW WHEN YOU WOULD LIKE TO VISIT. I will meet you there. I am one of the people who interact daily with tourists and residents. The Gallery is the former Gulf Coast Museum of Art, located in the Botanical Gardens in Largo. The devastating news is that it was defunded during the recession, I think around 2008. The buildings went into rapid decline. Since that time, Creative Pinellas has restored the museum to its original beauty. We had over 20,000 visitors last year; 19,000 so far this year. With regards to tourism, nearly 1 out of 3 visitors are from another county, state, or country. Although they might not come to our county for the explicit purpose of visiting the Gallery at Creative Pinellas, the experience they have there leaves them with an even more favorable memory of our county. They say they want to return again soon. Families and other visitors can only stay at the beach for so many days before they need a respite, and this is the one place in Largo they can go. With regard to our residents, I have to ask, if Creative Pinellas is defunded: What about the veterans who cross 113 St in their wheelchairs to visit the gallery each week? What about the new mothers and their children who come to create in our gallery's art room? What about the home-schoolers? What about the hundreds of children who have had their art displayed at the gallery each year? What about the Adults with Disabilities group that visits our exhibitions each month? What about the Memory care group from a local Assisted Living who visit our gallery? When they visited last month, a gentleman with Alzheimer's said to me: "Thank you for letting us visit. Message Greetings to the Pinellas County BOCC —

I am a past, two-term, county-appointed director on the PHCSA board (2013-2017) and am currently serving my second term on the Dunedin Fine Art Center board of directors. I am also a long-time member of the faculty there as the head of DFAC's printmaking program and studio.

My contractor husband and I have lived in Pinellas County since 1983 and my entire professional life as an artist was spent here in Pinellas. I was a designer and art director in advertising and magazine publishing; a storyboard artist in the feature film business in FL and in television news as a senior broadcast designer. I am well aware of the importance of the arts as a driver of creative industry in this area, and after leaving corporate work at FOX13 in 1998, I started teaching at USF and DFAC.

Teaching is the thing I have enjoyed most in the latter part of my art career, and in 2017 and 2018, I was asked to formally serve as a mentor to two artists in Creative Pinellas's

Emerging Artist Grant Program. This program pairs artists either starting their careers or moving them into a more professional phase later in their lives with experienced, well-connected working professionals like myself.

BOCC that CP's grant programs are just "giving money for artists to buy easels and cameras and things like that." This shows a clear misunderstanding about what professional practice mentorships do and what CP's grant program is for, which is career advancement. The candidates are all fully vetted; only a few in each year's class makes the cut. The program requires a detailed plan and strict goal benchmarks leading up to the annual exhibit and beyond, including what they're going to use the grant money for — and why.

Both of my mentees excelled in the program. One of them, for example: Brandie D., is an accomplished printmaker, photographer and former student of mine. She is a Coast Guard veteran and a former Florida State Park ranger. She successfully completed the program under my mentorship. using her grant money to purchase a 19" Richeson etching press that would've been out of reach on her modest state salary. She used the press and goals made with the mentorship to create, illustrate and enhance programs as a regional director of volunteer services in both the Florida State Park system and later in the Florida Trail Association. She is especially interested in veteran's programs that use wilderness as a means of coping with PTSD and so she was one of the three veterans profiled in and selected for the video journey on Florida's waterways and trails in the 2024 documentary shown on WEDU, "O2O: Path To Connection". Her printmaking skills and that etching press were used in the making of the graphics and animation for the film. She has just started grad school in her mid-thirties, working on her printmaking MFA in order to begin teaching and to continue working with veterans in this next phase of her life. I wrote one of her letters of recommendation and I continue to stay in contact, advising her and critiquing her work in her studies.

what Creative Pinellas offers when I was a UF graduate, right out of school, trying to cobble together a career in illustration and graphic design in Pinellas County in the 1980s during a recession. I didn't know anyone here and didn't know how to connect with anyone in my field.

Let me address another criticism made of Creative Pinellas, that its funding is supposed to drive tourism. That's just one aspect of its programs and value to Pinellas. Retaining CP is also a quality-of-life issue. Are the county's wonderful parks and beaches also being forced to monetize or are they meant to be enjoyed as part of the county's attractiveness to residents?

Pinellas County is known as an arts destination. We have excellent performing arts theaters. We have a symphony. We have a collection of superb, world-class art museums, attracting national and international visitors, but none would exist unless they were supported by full and part time county resident memberships. They know their demographic or they wouldn't have built them here. DFAC is one of the largest community art centers in the country, with top-notch faculty, studios and programs, but we would not exist without the interest by the local community. The arts are an attractor for permanent and seasonal residence in this county by the affluent and non-affluent alike, supporting our year-round tax base.

Pinellas County is known as a beach and sports tourism destination. The parks are visited by tourists, of course, but they are mainly used year-round by locals. Tourists come here for the beaches, but so do our residents in choosing to move and raise their families and stay here. Recreation is an attractor for permanent and seasonal residence in this county by the affluent and non-affluent alike, supporting our year-round tax base. SEPISEP

The arts, like our beaches, boating, parks and sports are what make Pinellas County not only a great place for tourists, but most especially for us: residents and their families.

Personally, beaches and baseball are not my jam, but the arts and sailing definitely are and both have kept me here long after I expected to leave after the end of my professional corporate design career and my husband's retirement from construction management.

There's a lot of overlap.

Creative Pinellas isn't a club for hobbyists handing out taxpayer money for art supplies; it's a serious organization wholly interconnected with artists, programs, schools, museums and other institutions throughout the entire community. Creative Pinellas is helping them to adapt to a creative job field in flux. Not only for the artists hitting career headwinds now, but for future working professionals and educators later.

Respectfully, I hope you will all consider the impact of what losing Creative Pinellas would mean for them [SEP] SEP]

It is with great concern that I have learned of the Pinellas County Commission's consideration to eliminate funding for Creative Pinellas.

For more than a decade, I have worked with Creative Pinellas both directly and indirectly. Six of those years I served as Associate Director of the St. Petersburg Arts Alliance with John Collins. In many funding opportunities, we relied on Creative Pinellas as the official Local Arts Agency for the County. Throughout its history, Creative Pinellas has provided leadership to the arts community, helping to create Pinellas County as a serious arts destination.

The County Statute 265.32 "County Fine Arts Council" clearly outlines the responsibilities of such an agency. These include:

- (a) Stimulating greater governmental and public awareness and appreciation of the importance of the arts to the people of Florida.
- (b) Encouraging and facilitating greater and more efficient use of governmental and private resources for the development and support of the arts.
- (c) Encouraging and facilitating opportunities for Florida residents to participate in artistic activities.
- (d) Promoting the development of Florida artists, arts institutions, community organizations sponsoring arts activities, and audiences.
- (e) Surveying and assessing the needs of the arts, artists, arts institutions, community organizations sponsoring arts activities, and people of this state relating to the arts.
- (f) Supporting and facilitating the preservation and growth of the state's artistic resources.
- (g) Contracting for artistic services, performances, and exhibits.
- (h) Developing a center or complex of physical facilities for the use of the arts.
- (i) Providing financial and technical assistance to artists, arts institutions, and audiences.
- (j) Otherwise serving the citizens of the county and state in the realm of the arts.

Creative Pinellas has lived up to its responsibilities to the County in numerous ways including:

- Maintaining the Gallery (a Pinellas Parks Department property), with a current \$200,000 privately funded upgrade underway
- Partnering with the County on Graffiti Abatement through murals and signal box projects
- Opening and managing the art gallery at PIE Airport and its art collection (funded by the airport)

- Securing a 5 year contract with the Lealman CRA with annual deliverables
- Partnering with Pinellas County Schools on Youth Art Month, middle school and high school exhibitions, with plans for further expansion..
- Completing an inventory of the County's public art collection.
- Partnering with VSPC to showcase local artists at national events such as the Piedmont Park Fine Arts Festival and regional IPW travel show.

Recognizing the economic importance of tourism, Creative Pinellas has also shifted to strengthen its alignment with visitor engagement:

- Hiring a Curatorial Director with arts and tourism marketing expertise.
- Bringing on as Managing Editor of *Arts Coast Magazine*, a former Tampa Bay Times writer and contributor to VSPC's *Gulf to Bay* destination magazine, with a focus on long-range calendars, artist spotlights and visitor-centered stories.
- Recruiting VSPC Kylie Kiaz as a grants panelist to enhance tourism partnerships
- Refocusing Individual Artist Grants into "Making Waves", a program with strong tourism connections.

The arts contribute significantly to our local economy and to our community vitality. Visitors are essential, but so is a strong cultural fabric that makes Pinellas County an inspiring place to live, work, and create. Creative Pinellas is indispensable to both goals.

I strongly urge you to reconsider any proposal to defund Creative Pinellas. The organization has proven its ability to deliver a strong return on investment for the County, adapt to evolving priorities, and foster the kind of cultural excellence that makes Pinellas thrive.

That camera allowed me to capture quality images and catalog my work. My business grew exponentially. My social media following went from 4,000 to over 80,000. For that, I thank you. And since that grant and my show at Creative Pinellas, I have been able to open an art center that provides studios to several other artists. This year I'll be taking out an SBA loan for a million dollars to purchase a building so that my company can grow and bring over two hundred thousand dollars a year in revenue for the county by way of workshops for artists who will travel to our county from all over the world. Vice-Chair Eggers - As one of your constituents, I am appalled that the commission is considering defunding Creative Pinellas, our countywide arts agency.

Pinellas County is well-known for its arts, and an essential part of that is having a healthy arts agency. Defunding the County's arts agency would minimize the importance of cultural tourism in our area just as Creative Pinellas has been further providing a vibrant arts environment for our visitors. Defunding Creative Pinellas would also hurt hundreds of small businesses, educators, and nonprofits that rely on arts-related spending. The nonprofit arts and culture sector in Pinellas County supports almost five-thousand jobs. Defunding would result in lost economic momentum and could undermine millions in public and private investments already made.

As an active Artist, I know that the Arts drive tourism and revenue to local businesses. Did you know that Cultural tourism in Pinellas County generates \$350 million annually through ticket sales, lodging, food, and other local spending, directly tied to organizations like Creative Pinellas? For every \$1 invested in the arts, communities see a \$7–\$9 return through local spending and economic activity. The 4.1 million annual attendees at Pinellas County's nonprofit arts and culture events spend an average of almost \$36 per person, per event, beyond the cost of admission – on items such as meals, parking, and lodging. 34% of the attendees live outside of Pinellas County; they average about \$46 in event-related spending per person per event. Arts tourists are ideal visitors, staying longer and spending more than non-Arts tourists.

The arts is what make our community unique. I don't want to live in a cookie-cutter corporate town that looks like any other. They've been instrumental in the development of the murals around town, which give our town so much character.

My property taxes are not going down, only up, and so are everyone else's. The county has the funds to continue Creative Pinellas. This proposal is short-sighted deinvestment in a vital part of our community. Don't do it, Christa Fairbrother

Dear Commissioner Eggers,

Regarding yesterday's suggestion to defund Creative Pinellas, I think you might be pleasantly surprised to learn of the significant changes we have made to our operations. I too, have shared some of these same concerns that were made yesterday, and have made it my mission as CEO to fulfill our responsibility to the County.

We have launched two major cultural tourism initiatives at no additional expense to the County:

- 1. Earlier this summer, we completely revamped our grant program. We are now using our TDT funds on Making Waves, a funding program to create arts experiences for visitors in the places they gather beaches, museums, and in the outdoor spaces Pinellas County is known for. Making Waves will inject nearly \$120,000 into our tourism facing communities.
- 2. We are showcasing cultural events specifically to visitors through Current|Culture our new online magazine that launches Oct. 4th. This magazine is designed to help visitors plan their vacations around the many events, festivals, and arts activities we are known for.
- 3. We have strategically hired a senior leadership team experienced in arts + tourism:
- -Allison McCarthy, Curatorial Director: 10 years at The Dalí Museum; former Executive Director of the Clearwater Arts Alliance; arts consultant to the Florida Department of State. Maggie Duffy, Editor: Former Tampa Bay Times arts writer, Bay Magazine columnist, and annual contributor to VSPC's *Gulf to Bay* destination magazine.
- 4. I also wanted to take a moment to walk through our budget to illustrate exactly how we are using County funds and supplement your support with outside funding. We work diligently to secure funding from outside sources for non-tourism related initiatives, and will continue to do so. This includes:
- \$150,000 from the State Department of Cultural Affairs to pay for our gallery staff. These *non-County funds* pay the salaries of our gallery staff.

We have become the County's public art partner, with the following long and short-term contracts in place to support beautification and wayfinding initiatives:

- o \$250,000 five-year contract with Lealman CRA (\$50,000 annually)
- o \$20,000 annual contract with St. Pete-Clearwater International Airport to curate and manage their new Sightline Gallery, as well as maintain and care for the public art held at the airport.
- o Tax Collectors office murals: \$10,000
- o National Endowment for the Arts: \$40,000
- o Foundation for a Healthy St. Pete recently awarded us \$31,6000 to support County health initiatives through the arts.

In short, we are leveraging County dollars with hundreds of thousands of additional contracted work and non-County funds each year.

5. The share of our budget that derives from TDT and County funds is actually shrinking and is at a historic low. We accomplish our incredible work (including distributing nearly

\$225,000 in grants last year) with what is, relatively speaking, a very small percentage of the County and TDT funds:

Our \$861,000 TDT line item amounts to less than 1% of the \$94million in TDT funds collected in 2024

The \$156,600 we receive from the County general fund amounts to less than .001% of the County's budget.

Everything we have implemented and accomplished during my tenure as CEO is designed to ensure that we remain trustworthy county partners and that the County does see a solid ROI on your investment in the arts.

In light of this shared information, I respectfully request the opportunity to work with you and your colleagues at a public workshop to assess our strengths as the designated Local Arts Agency for Pinellas County and how we might continue to move forward supporting your initiatives.

As you may be aware, there is a proposal underway to de-fund Creative Pinellas, the County's designated local arts agency since 2011.

Given that Creative Pinellas and Visit St. Pete/Clearwater (VSPC) have been steadily building a partnership that strategically utilizes the arts as a driver to the destination, this ninth-hour proposal, which I wasn't aware of, was a shocking moment for all of us here at Creative Pinellas.

Recent work with Brian and his team includes:

- A collaborative activation with artist Angela Warren at IPW
- A collaborative visit to the Piedmont Park Fine Art Festival with three Pinellas County artists
- A co-branded Still Shining exhibition featuring local artists

I have been working in good faith with VSPC's team to identify their needs and develop cultural tourism programs that support the County's tourism initiatives, and am proud of the shifts we have made to better align ourselves with these goals. In fact, we are working toward a system where our two teams begin sharing visitor engagement data to better understand how cultural tourism impacts visitor attendance, spending, and satisfaction with the destination.

Our roles are *complementary, not interchangeable,* and removing or reducing Creative Pinellas weakens the foundation on which cultural tourism depends. We are known as an arts destination in large part because of our work to create a thriving cultural community, and we will continue to grow and refine our efforts in the coming months and years - with continued support.

To that end, based on suggestions from VSPC on how we can best serve as a visitation attendance driver, here are three major Creative PInellas initiatives in place or launching shortly:

<u>Making Waves</u>, our bold new competitive arts grant, which brings together our vibrant cultural community and the breathtaking natural beauty of Pinellas County to create a countywide gallery of exhibitions, performances, and arts experiences. Our guiding message in this: *A vacation isn't just about where you go—it's about*

what you discover. Running from April 1 - May 30, 2026 Making Waves will bring art to visitors to create something truly unforgettable.

CURRENT | CULTURE, our new visitor-specific online magazine, is a traveler's guide to local culture - launching Oct. 4th. Current | Culture highlights the unique experiences that make our community a must-visit destination - exactly what data shows cultural visitors, younger audiences, and families are seeking. The magazine is built around high/low and shoulder seasons, with information designed to reach visitors in the 59-65 day period when they begin planning their visits.

<u>Sightline Gallery at PIE:</u> Reaching over 2million visitors per year, this is the perfect site for arts engagement messaging. We are planning a joint exhibition with Heritage Village and Florida Botanical Gardens for sprint 2026, leveraging visibility at the airport to draw visitors to Pinewood Park.

Our Current Funding Reality: Low Draw/High Results

- Of the \$94 million in bed tax revenue generated in 2024, Creative Pinellas receives less than 1%
- From the County Operating Budget, Creative Pinellas receives only 0.004% of the total budget.

These modest investments sustain the entire Pinellas County cultural infrastructure, which in turn fuels cultural tourism and economic growth. We also leverage County funds to raise our own funding.

- We are in the midst of a \$200,000 upgrade to our facilities using non-county funds raised through grants. This will enhance our draw as a cultural destination.
- Our gallery staff are paid for by a Florida Department of State grant no County funds are currently being used to support our gallery team.

I respectfully ask for your support in strengthening Creative Pinellas in partnership with VSPC. A different path forward would allow for greater sharing of resources, such as increased strategic arts marketing and visitor traffic analytics, to measure engagement with the cultural community. This approach delivers far greater impact than shifting arts funding into tourism marketing alone. Maintaining mindful funding for Creative Pinellas will continue to yield exponential returns in economic impact, visitor engagement, and increased visibility with these changes in focus and resource allocation. We are poised and ready to move forward, working closely with both our tourism partners, as well as the larger County team.

I am writing to express my deep concern regarding the proposed defunding of Creative Pinellas. As a vital steward of the arts in our region, Creative Pinellas plays an indispensable role not only for artists but for the broader business and tourism ecosystem.

Creative Pinellas is an economic engine. According to the 2022 Arts & Economic Prosperity 6 study, Pinellas County's nonprofit arts and culture sector generated \$294.7 million in economic activity—comprised of \$126.8 million in organizational spending and an additional \$167.9 million in audience-related expenditures. This investment supported 4,528 jobs, contributed \$185.3 million in personal income, and generated \$58.9 million in tax revenue—all within our community.

The creative sector is a major employer and industry. It employs over 53,000 people locally, fuels \$3.6 billion in industry earnings, and includes more than

\$80 million in nonprofit revenues.

Moreover, arts and culture account for nearly 5.8% of all local businesses, generating \$1.96

billion annually and nearly 4.3% of regional GDP.

Arts tourism is key to Pinellas' identity and prosperity. Nearly 34% of arts attendees come from

outside the county, spending an average of \$46 per visit—not for beaches, but for cultural

experiences. In St. Petersburg alone, nonprofit arts generated \$132.5 million in economic

activity, supporting 2,121 jobs and contributing \$26.5 million in tax revenues.

Creative Pinellas also leads critical community initiatives—public art programs, environmental

projects, arts access in reinvestment zones, gallery spaces like Sightline at PIE, graffiti-

abatement programs, summer camp scholarships for kids and more. Defunding this agency

would jeopardize our ability to sustain this artistic infrastructure and destabilize the arts ecosystem prevalent throughout Pinellas County.

While Visit St. Pete-Clearwater plays an important role in our region's tourism, Creative Pinellas

fills a unique and essential need—creating culture, connecting arts, economic development, equity, environmental advocacy, and community cohesion in ways commercial tourism cannot.

I urge you to keep Creative Pinellas' funding to maintain our region's creative spirit, support thousands of jobs, bolster tourism, enhance civic pride, and preserve Pinellas County's reputation as an arts destination.

On a personal level, I have been employed by Creative Pinellas in 2019 and again earlier this year helping to establish the county's mural program and assisting Lealman with the implementation of public works of art. I know first hand this organization is vital to Pinellas County. It may not seem obvious if you're not looking to recognize the value of the arts, but its woven into nearly every aspect of life here. - Arts tourism attracts higher-spending, longer-staying visitors than beach-only travelers.
- Cities that have leaned into cultural identity—like Asheville, Austin, and Santa Fe—have proven that investing in the arts creates long-term, resilient tourism economies.

I am writing about the proposed budget cuts to Creative Pinellas. I heard a comment made by Brian Scott questioning Creative Pinellas' value and suggestion that half of their total budget be wiped away and the other half to be used to create a competitive artist grant program. Does Mr. Scott not realize that a large part of what Creative Pinellas does is manage a competitive artist grant program?

According to the Florida Department of State, Florida's arts and cultural industry generated \$5.8 billion of economic activity, including \$2.9 billion by nonprofit arts and cultural organizations (of which Creative Pinellas is one).

Studies have found that in Pinellas County, the arts sector consistently generates greater economic activity and a higher number of jobs than sports. In addition, the nonprofit arts and culture sector's annual economic impact surpasses that of sports in the Tampa Bay area.

Funding Creative Pinellas is a very small amount compared to the entire county budget but the support for art is so important at this time so please do not cut their funding.

Dear Commissioner Scott,

As a Chamber CEO and a Pinellas County resident with three school aged children, I am deeply saddened and concerned by the possibility of Creative Pinellas being defunded. As a board member to the organization, I have witnessed incredible growth and leadership with CEO Margaret Murray at the helm. Creative Pinellas has done an excellent job of shifting priorities to align with Pinellas County, a shift that many other nonprofits would struggle to pull off. Through their partnership with VSPC and their new Making Waves program, Creative Pinellas has prioritized tourism while strengthening the arts culture in our county.

Of the \$94 million in bed tax revenue generated in 2024, Creative Pinellas received just 0.8% (less than 1%). From the County Operating Budget, Creative Pinellas receives only 0.004% of the total budget. These modest investments sustain the entire countywide cultural infrastructure, which in turn fuels cultural tourism and economic growth.

To maximize the return on county investment, we should strengthen Creative Pinellas in partnership with VSPC, allowing for greater sharing of resources, such as increased strategic arts marketing and visitor traffic analytics, to measure engagement with the cultural community and. This approach delivers far greater impact than shifting arts funding into tourism marketing alone. Creative Pinellas builds and sustains the arts ecosystem—supporting artists, cultural organizations, and community development. VSPC markets cultural assets to global audiences, bringing visitors who stay in hotels, eat in restaurants, and spend in local businesses.

Their roles are complementary, not interchangeable. Removing or reducing Creative Pinellas weakens the foundation on which cultural tourism depends. Maintaining mindful funding for Creative Pinellas will yield exponential returns in economic impact, visitor engagement, and increased visibility with these vetted changes in focus and resource allocation.

In light of this shared information, I respectfully request that there be a public workshop to assess the strengths of Creative Pinellas as the designated Local Arts Agency for Pinellas County and how the organization might continue to move forward supporting county initiatives.

While I have never personally received one of their art grants, I have continually had the opportunity to apply and be considered. One artist, Jennifer Chandley, received one of these grants a couple of years ago and I got to attend an artist talk where she went in depth about how her art was a vessel of healing through her life experiences.

Being a part of the community here in pinellas county, even outside of being an artist, I feel that art beautifies our community to a great degree. It helps unify us, when one artist starts a conversation through their work or about their work, it opens up the opportunity for the rest of us to weigh in. This connection is something I find unique to the arts, it's almost like both an icebreaker and something tangible that serves to deepen one anothers connection. Often, art or the meaning of art is not something singularly understood; For example, the artist Jennifer Chandley opened up about her personal life, but that just brought more people into the conversation about their own personal lives. In addition, the interpretation of our feelings has a range far beyond one person's definition of a particular subject or realm of focus.

While some people may hold the opinion that feelings and art are insignificant in the larger scope of things, on the contrary, it is a navigational tool built on inclusivity. Even just thinking of our history, when we think of centuries ago, it feels so separate from our today. But art is a written record that shows our innate human sensibilities evolving through time, bridging the past to the present, and posing the question of what our future has in store. That implores you and the other commissioners to envision what our community's future has in store: Will we be a community that ignores the humanistic need to connect and evolve through art by defunding our arts organizations, or will we uplift the voices that serve to educate, inform, and further develop our culture?

I am writing to share what Creative Pinellas has meant to me personally, as both a lifelong resident and an emerging artist in Pinellas County. Murals along the Pinellas Trail, at Belcher and Alderman Roads in Palm Harbor, and the signal box projects are all examples of how Creative Pinellas has made our community more beautiful and inspiring. These projects support tourism by turning our public spaces into cultural landmarks.

Last year, I received an Ignite grant from Creative Pinellas. While the grant itself was small (\$500), the impact was immense. I used the funds to build a public zine stand at the Palm Harbor Library, which now features over 200 zines from nearly 100 different artists. Zines are small, self-published works that provide raw and honest perspectives from people of all backgrounds. This project is especially meaningful because very few libraries across the country have public zine collections, making it a unique cultural feature that both residents and visitors can enjoy. Zines capture the voices of a

community —offering a cultural record of ideas, stories, and creativity that is diverse, unfiltered, and accessible. Visitors who encounter this collection not only discover something unexpected and memorable, but also gain insight into the cultural life of Pinellas County.

This is just one example of how Creative Pinellas empowers residents to make a difference in their own communities. What Commissioner Scott described as "grant programs that they're giving money for artists to buy easels and cameras and things like that. And it's not going to tourism at all." doesn't capture the full story. These grants are not handouts—they are investments that yield real cultural, educational, and economic returns for the county.

Creative Pinellas actively engages with tourism, directly addressing one of the main concerns raised about continuing their funding. They recently debuted a new art gallery, Sightline, at St. Pete–Clearwater International Airport (PIE), designed to connect travelers with the vibrant arts community of Pinellas County. Their upcoming Making Waves program is another strong example of how Creative Pinellas promotes cultural tourism. In April–May 2026, Making Waves will bring together our vibrant cultural community through a series of exhibitions, performances, and arts experiences that highlight the natural beauty of our county. This series of events invites visitors to not only vacation here, but to be immersed in the creativity and culture of Pinellas County. Myself and many other artists already applied for this grant by cutting funding for Creative Pinellas, you're discarding fully developed projects that artists have spent weeks putting together. This is an organization with proven momentum, and taking that away without a stronger alternative in place would be a huge loss for both artists and the community.

Defunding Creative Pinellas would mean losing not just support for artists, but a vital force that enriches our neighborhoods, supports local businesses through cultural tourism, and strengthens Pinellas County's identity as a vibrant, creative place to live and visit.

I urge you to continue funding Creative Pinellas, not just for the benefit of artists like me, but for the benefit of our entire community and the many visitors who come here to experience something special.

No color, no nurturing of the spirit, a life without the creative arts. All of this the results of accidentally killing one little primitive butterfly 75m years ago.

The arts (beauty, creativity and expression) are vital, not only for our communities, but for the enrichment of the humanity that includes all of us. Because of that, I request that you and your constituents consider the ramifications--not just next year but for years to come--of a decision to defund the support of the arts. Thank you for taking the time to read this communication and considering it's contents. I hope you are persuaded, at least, to reconsider your recent decision. Creative expression goes where it is welcomed and it leaves where it is not welcomed.

I'm asking you to retain funding for Creative Pinellas, our county's designated arts agency since 2011, responsible for public art, artist grants, and arts-tourism marketing with Visit St. Pete-Clearwater. Cutting the agency would undercut proven economic drivers and a core part of our visitor brand. The evidence: Arts are a jobs-and-revenue engine here. In 2022, nonprofit arts and culture in Pinellas County generated \$294.7M in economic activity, supported 4,528 jobs, and produced \$58.9M in tax revenues at all levels of government. One-third of attendees were visitors from outside the county, and they spent ~\$46 per person in our local businesses. That's a measurable return on a comparatively small public investment. Creative Pinellas is the infrastructure you already have. It connects local artists, venues, and visitors; it's the county's established conduit for grants and cultural programming. Eliminating it outright, rather than updating goals and metrics, throws away working capacity and institutional knowledge. Tourism momentum is real, and the arts help sustain it. January 2025 set a record for Pinellas bed-tax collections (\$8.29M), and St. Petersburg itself broke its January record. Why risk weakening a sector that helps keep visitors spending year-round? If the concern is performance, set clear targets (audience reach, private match, earned media, visitor conversion) and require quarterly reporting. But don't zero out the line. Even recent coverage of this proposal frames it as a sudden move; a better path is performance-based reform, not elimination. Please keep Creative Pinellas in the FY26 budget and direct staff to return with outcome-based

has been slow. Tourism is and will continue to be impacted by the federal administration. Pinellas County had long been a favorite destination for visitors from Canada, England and Germany, among other countries. Those target markets do not feel welcome in the U.S. In the months ahead, the tourist development tax will take a hit.

- Pinellas County consumers have only begun to see the impact of tariffs taxes charged to consumers for imported goods. Businesses front-loaded inventory, while those consumers who could afford them front-loaded purchases. If consumers thought inflation was bad before, it's only the tip of the iceberg. The \$3.18 price tag on a SNICKERS® candy bar at a local store serves as evidence. Companies think consumers are stupid, too. We are wise to shrink-flation practices and find it insulting.
- We have only begun to see the negative impact of ICE raids and the deportation of America's workforce agricultural/farm workers, construction laborers, landscapers, etc. Those jobs will be difficult to fill as Americans will NOT do that work for the same low wage. Employers will need to pay more, and so Pinellas County consumers will face rising costs.
- Pinellas County housing costs have forced workers to move to nearby counties, placing more demands on our roadways and resulting in traffic. Thank goodness for remote work.
- Grant funds have dried up for many non-profits. How can they continue to operate without cutting their workforce?
- The events of the last eight months are having chilling effects, particularly on low- and middle-income families who were already struggling due to inflation. The elderly seniors, especially those relying solely on Medicare and Medicaid, are the most vulnerable.

My family's automotive dealerships have operated in Pinellas County for over 101 years and pay significant taxes each year. You can be assured that I understand and care deeply about how our tax dollars are used, about the bottom line and return on investment.

My background and education is in both Finance and Art Administration and I have spent 22+ years, 17 in NYC, working as a Cultural Strategist, helping global organizations and companies drive strategy by activating cultural strategies.

From my experience, as a cultural strategist and business leader and entrepreneur, I can tell you that defunding Creative Pinellas does not serve the best short or long term interest of residents and visitors to Pinellas County.

As a business leader and entrepreneur responsible for both a century-old company and a new cultural tourism startup, I assure you: long-term investment in the arts is good business. The County's financial support of Creative Pinellas, leverages hundreds of times more in private investment, cultural tourism dollars and tax revenue, which is the type of stewardship your constituency expects and respects from you.

I am writing to you in respect to the proposed defunding of Creative Pinellas. As the managing editor of Creative Pinellas' soon-to-launch online magazine, I urge you to continue funding Creative Pinellas rather than redirecting those dollars to Visit St. Pete-Clearwater.

While I only came on board back in May, as a longtime arts professional in Pinellas County and the former arts writer for the Tampa Bay Times, I have watched Creative Pinellas from its inception blossom into the organization it is today.

The impact of Creative Pinellas on the community includes, but is not limited to, the grants it provides to artists and arts organizations, although those are vital for building and maintaining the vibrant arts destination that is Pinellas County.

Creative Pinellas does so much for the arts in the community in myriad ways, including providing a place for artists to exhibit and sell work in the gallery, leading professional artist development workshops, placing artwork from Pinellas County artists at the St. Pete Clearwater International Airport, and on beautification projects throughout the county.

Because of the work Creative Pinellas does, Pinellas County youth get to experience participating in art, through exhibitions and art summer camps. This year, Creative Pinellas gave \$63,000 from the County General Fund directly to arts camps across Pinellas County—supporting program fees, need-based scholarships, and access for PCS students and families. Those kinds of experiences can be life-changing for kids.

Creative Pinellas is focused on being a driver of cultural tourism through two new initiatives, Making Waves, a new pilot program that connects the cultural community with the places people gather - Pinellas County's beautiful beaches, parks and outdoor spaces - to create a countywide exhibition with live performances and arts experiences.

CURRENT|CULTURE is our new online magazine geared toward attracting visitors to Pinellas County as a traveler's guide to local culture. It launches on Oct. 4. The magazine also pays local writers to contribute; another layer of the arts economy.

Please don't defund Creative Pinellas. It's a treasure and resource on which many Pinellas County residents rely.



Thank you for your continued service and commitment to the residents of Pinellas County. I recognize the challenges you face in balancing priorities at the state, federal, and local levels, and I am deeply appreciative of your leadership during these times.

I write to express my strong opposition to any effort to delete, downsize, or absorb the Pinellas County Office of Human Rights (OHR) into another department.

The OHR plays a vital role in protecting residents against discrimination in housing, employment, public accommodations, government programs, and wage theft. Its work goes far beyond investigation—last year alone, OHR successfully mediated or settled over 400 cases, including HUD conciliations, EEOC mediations, wage theft recoveries, and public accommodation complaints. These efforts have

returned much-needed resources to working families and upheld the promise of fairness in our community.

Key points to consider:

Federal and Local Value: OHR is contracted by HUD and EEOC, allowing local resolution of cases that save both time and taxpayer dollars.

Cost Efficiency: Its budget is small relative to the overall county budget (a proposed reduction of only \$1.5M in Personal Services).

Qualified Staff: OHR employees hold specialized certifications that ensure expertise in highly regulated areas of law.

Right-Sized & Effective: The office is not overstaffed and consistently exceeds performance expectations.

No True Savings in Dissolution: Absorbing OHR into another department would not reduce costs—it would only redistribute them, while weakening focus and accountability.

The Office of Human Rights exists because forward-thinking leaders recognized the necessity of enforcement mechanisms to protect equality and ensure justice. While we cannot legislate morality, we can enforce accountability. Eliminating or weakening OHR would undermine decades of progress and remove a proven resource that residents, businesses, and federal partners rely on.

Dear Commissioners:

Today I received several calls and emails from colleagues and other concerned members of our community regarding the attempt by a few Board members to dismantle the Pinellas County Office of Human Rights. Wanting to hear exactly what was said for myself I sat through the entire workshop video from August 28, 2025 and was more than a little concerned about some of the information and misinformation that was shared. Although I am unclear where this information came from, I am hopeful that you will allow this missive to provide first-hand, boots on the ground, facts.

For purposes of this communication, I am going to focus on my expertise as it relates to the fair housing component of this office. I can reach out to colleagues with knowledge related to other areas this department handles if that would be of assistance – please just let me know.

Many years ago a group of lawyers, government officials, realtors and various laypeople created the Tri-County Fair Housing Consortium out of need. We were seeing more and more cases of discrimination against families, children, people with disabilities and people of various races and religions being denied the basic right of a roof over their heads. I have spoken on this topic to legal groups, realtors, landlords and home and condo association just to name a few and they are always shocked at what they learn. The mom who applies for an apartment and is directed to a unit in the back by the dumpster while the single guy in the sports car is driven in a golfcart to view a unit by the pool. The children who were denied a swing set or the right to ride their bikes. The man who was blind and just wanted a side porch so he could sit outside in cooler weather. The foster parent who was required to pay extra rent when he arranged for somewhere his foster kids could stay. The cruelty and bad acts of others does not go away because you disband the office who investigates it. The bad actors are simply emboldened.

For several years I handled all the fair housing litigation for the City of St Petersburg and the County of Pinellas. In every case I had the distinct gift of working with Suzanne Mucklow, researcher extraordinaire who worked with the Clerk's office and various trained professionals who worked as investigators for the Office of Human Rights. Under the law, a pre-suit investigation is a mandatory prerequisite before a lawsuit can be filed and that investigator is then an essential witness at trial.

Pinellas County has the distinct honor of taking the very first fair housing case to a jury trial in the history of the Middle District of Florida. The judge was Magistrate Scriven who is now a sitting Federal Judge. One of the key witnesses was the investigator from the PCOHR. We were victorious in that case and it remained the only fair housing jury verdict for many years. I saw Judge Scriven at a seminar a few months ago and she is still moved by the facts from that case.

In 2008 St Petersburg rescinded their own human rights ordinance based squarely on the assurance that the PCOHR would be there to continue to protect its citizens. The agreement did not envision an out of the area agency that no one can reach and that has no interest in serving our community. I heard two commissioners talk about duplication of services but that supposes that there is another service out there. I strongly encourage anyone who is truly interested to try and get a case from our area properly investigated by someone other than the PCOHR.

During the meeting I also heard one commissioner identify his primary goal as rollbacks. I am genuinely hopeful that was not an accurate statement. A rollback cannot possibly be the primary goal, Or even a secondary goal. Being a good financial steward cannot possibly mean leaving our most vulnerable citizens unprotected.

I implore this Board to be good listeners and caring human beings. Someone mentioned a separate workshop to discuss this department. Let me come and tell you about the good this department has done. How it works. Why it matters and why it cannot be moved elsewhere and added to someone else's duties. Allow me to share inspirational truths about the difference the PCOHR made in your constituents' lives. As I write this I am sitting here staring at a letter from a lawyer for a mobile home park hired to evict a severely disabled senior woman from the mobile home she owns because she put a small gate on her front porch and that gate violates a rule related to outdoor fencing. The gate is clearly a fair and reasonable accommodation that is allowed under the law but without the help of the PCOHR there is no one there to help stop that eviction. What would you have me tell this woman?

Subject: Upholding the Pinellas County Home Rule Charter – Office of Human Rights

Dear Commissioners,

I am writing to express deep concern regarding the proposal to dismantle or diminish the Pinellas County Office of Human Rights (OHR). This proposal raises serious legal and ethical issues, as the Pinellas County Home Rule Charter explicitly requires protection of human rights from unlawful discrimination.

Article 2, Section 2.04 of the Charter mandates ordinances that safeguard citizens from discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations. These protections were later expanded to include individuals with disabilities. This language is clear: human rights protections are not optional—they are required under the governing law of this County.

It is also important to note that these provisions were strengthened under the leadership of Leon W. Russell, now Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National NAACP, during his tenure as the founding Director of the OHR. His work ensured that Pinellas County moved from a history of exclusion toward a framework that demanded equity and opportunity for all residents.

Further, the Board of County Commissioners does not have the authority to make a unilateral decision regarding the elimination or weakening of the OHR. Because the OHR was established under the Charter and as part of a legal remedy to systemic discrimination, any attempt to alter its authority, structure, or funding would require citizen affirmation and input. To bypass this process would constitute a direct violation of the Charter.

For reference, the full text of the Pinellas County Home Rule Charter can be accessed on the County's website here: <u>PInellas County Code of Ordinances Part I Charter</u>. We encourage each of you to review this Charter language, which clearly mandates the protection of human rights.

PInellas County Code of Ordinances Part I Charter

Whereas, the only legal method available to the board of county commissioners to define its powers, duties, and responsibilities under the Constitution of the State of Florida is the adoption of a Home Rule Charter, and

Should the Commission move forward with dismantling or diminishing the OHR, the St. Petersburg branch of the NAACP and its partners are prepared to take all necessary actions, including:

- Challenging the action as a violation of the Home Rule Charter in state court, seeking declaratory and injunctive relief.
- Revisiting the original federal discrimination lawsuit that led to the creation of the OHR, asserting that dismantling undermines the remedy established by that case.
- Filing new litigation under state and federal civil rights laws (including Title VII, the Fair Housing Act, the ADA, and the Florida Civil Rights Act).
- Pursuing citizen-led Charter enforcement or referendum challenges to ensure compliance with the Charter's requirements.

Please note that I have cc'd National NAACP Chairman Leon W. Russell, The Florida State Conference leadership and the NAACP Legal Defense team on this correspondence to ensure they are aware of this unilateral move being sought by one County Commissioner.

The St. Petersburg branch of the NAACP will view any effort to dismantle or weaken the OHR as a direct violation of both the Charter and the civil rights obligations owed to the residents of Pinellas County. We urge you to uphold the commitments embedded in the Charter and affirm your responsibility to safeguard the rights and protections it guarantees for all citizens.

Dear Commissioners,

I am writing to express deep concern regarding the proposal to dismantle or diminish the Pinellas County Office of Human Rights (OHR). This proposal raises serious legal and ethical issues, as the Pinellas County Home Rule Charter explicitly requires protection of human rights from unlawful discrimination.

Article 2, Section 2.04 of the Charter mandates ordinances that safeguard citizens from discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations. These protections were later expanded to include individuals with disabilities. This language is clear: human rights protections are not optional—they are required under the governing law of this County.

It is also important to note that these provisions were strengthened under the leadership of Leon W. Russell, now Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National NAACP, during his tenure as the founding Director of the OHR. His work ensured that Pinellas County moved from a history of exclusion toward a framework that demanded equity and opportunity for all residents.

Further, the Board of County Commissioners does not have the authority to make a unilateral decision regarding the elimination or weakening of the OHR. Because the OHR was established under the Charter and as part of a legal remedy to systemic discrimination, any attempt to alter its authority, structure, or funding would require citizen affirmation and input. To bypass this process would constitute a direct violation of the Charter.

For reference, the full text of the Pinellas County Home Rule Charter can be accessed on the County's website here: <u>PInellas County Code of Ordinances Part I Charter</u>. We encourage each of you to review this Charter language, which clearly mandates the protection of human rights.

PInellas County Code of Ordinances Part I Charter

Whereas, the only legal method available to the board of county commissioners to define its powers, duties, and responsibilities under the Constitution of the State of Florida is the adoption of a Home Rule Charter, and

Should the Commission move forward with dismantling or diminishing the OHR, the St. Petersburg branch of the NAACP and its partners are prepared to take all necessary actions, including:

- Challenging the action as a violation of the Home Rule Charter in state court, seeking declaratory and injunctive relief.
- Revisiting the original federal discrimination lawsuit that led to the creation of the OHR, asserting that dismantling undermines the remedy established by that case.
- Filing new litigation under state and federal civil rights laws (including Title VII, the Fair Housing Act, the ADA, and the Florida Civil Rights Act).
- Pursuing citizen-led Charter enforcement or referendum challenges to ensure compliance with the Charter's requirements.

Please note that I have cc'd National NAACP Chairman Leon W. Russell, The Florida State Conference leadership and the NAACP Legal Defense team on this correspondence to ensure they are aware of this unilateral move being sought by one County Commissioner.

The St. Petersburg branch of the NAACP will view any effort to dismantle or weaken the OHR as a direct violation of both the Charter and the civil rights obligations owed to the residents of Pinellas County. We urge you to uphold the commitments embedded in the Charter and affirm your responsibility to safeguard the rights and protections it guarantees for all citizens.
