OMB has no objection to the department submitting a grant application to the Florida Department of Children and Families to obtain funding to an expansion of the Office of the Public Defender's Pinellas County Crossover the Children's Program. The Office of the Public Defender, Sixth Judicial Circuit and its partner Ready for Life, Inc., will work in partnership with Pinellas County and the Public Safety Coordinating Council to administer the Road to Success project.

Requested funding is \$1.2M from the Criminal Justice, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant. A match is required. The \$1.2M matching funds are in-kind Public Defender personnel and operating costs. The funds will become available in July 1, 2020. The total cost of the program is \$2.4M. It is a three year grant.

**Proposed Abstract (Project Scope of Work):** The Office of the Public Defender, Sixth Judicial Circuit, and its partner Ready for Life, Inc., will work in partnership with Pinellas County and the Public Safety Coordinating Council to administer the Road to Success (RTS) project, an expansion of the Office of the Public Defender’s Pinellas County Crossover for Children’s Program. The population of focus is juvenile and young adults who have a mental illness, substance use disorder, or co-occurring mental health and substance use

disorders, and who are in, or at risk of entering, the criminal or juvenile justice systems.

**Benefit Summary (How will this benefit the County, Dept, etc?):** This expansion project will help provide intensive diversion services to 150 clients over 36 months, with the primary goal of diverting them from arrest, prosecution, or incarceration and into treatment and support services.

Anticipated outcomes include a decrease in recidivism, relapse, and risk factors/behaviors; and increases/improvements in education, transportation, employment, self-sufficiency, housing stability, overall health, and social connectedness, among others.
