Overtime Calculations for salaries:  
Officers or Detectives - the average hourly salary for officers/detectives is \$39.29 x 1.5 for overtime = \$58.93 Overtime rate  
Lieutenants – the average hourly salary for lieutenants is \$62.50 x 1.5 overtime = \$93.75 Overtime rate  
Sergeants – the average hourly salary for sergeants is \$53.61 x 1.5 overtime = \$80.41 Overtime rate  
In order to continue the SPPD’s concentrated effort to focus additional law enforcement resources on crime prevention and law enforcement initiatives designed to address specific crime-related issues throughout the city, the department will utilize a portion of the JAG funding to pay for overtime costs.  
The SPPD operates using the community policing strategy that utilizes all of the department’s resources to reduce crime and resolve issues that affect the quality of life in City neighborhoods.  
Overtime dollars will be used to add supplemental enforcement initiatives Citywide. With the additional overtime dollars, the SPPD can task officers to concentrate on specific issues, such as crime patterns at designated points throughout the City. This focused effort will address persistent issues.

<p>Funds will be used to support the Community Resource Centers, Volunteer Programs, and Officer Safety, and to print and disseminate Crime Prevention Educational materials. Grant funds will be used to pay utility fees and purchase supplies for the Community Resource Centers. The SPPD supports three affiliate Community Resource Centers that are strategically located throughout the City (Bartlett Park, Midtown, and Disston Plaza). These centers serve as hubs for information exchange between the SPPD and the citizens and provide field access to Police systems for officers working in the area of the center's location. Computer access to Police systems provides a vital resource that keeps Officers in the field as opposed to returning to the primary station to access information. The centers are staffed with volunteers, and they are also utilized as a gathering place where community-based groups and law enforcement can come together for information sharing and strategic planning. The SPPD has a strong volunteer workforce. Volunteers are utilized for responsibilities that include Volunteer Road Patrol, Disabled Parking Enforcement Patrol, Citizen-Based Crime Watch, and a Crime Prevention Citizens' Police Academy. The Academy is designed to familiarize citizens with police methodology and to raise awareness about community policing strategies and individual roles in making the community safer. Supplies to be purchased for citizens participating in the Volunteer Programs and the Crime Prevention Citizen's Police Academy trainees include but not limited to items that support their field functions and patrols, uniforms, training materials, certificates, and t-shirts for the Crime Prevention Citizens' Police Academy trainees.</p> <p>A highly specialized copier/printer is leased using JAG Crime Prevention funding to support Crime Prevention education programs. The copier/ printer is used to produce in large quantities educational materials for dissemination to the community and materials for department-initiated community-based training programs. <p>SPPD utilizes rental vehicles for select undercover operations. These vehicles are rented to facilitate the use of a variety of unmarked cars for special investigations like commercial burglary and prostitution operations. This resource enhances the effectiveness of these operations by creating the ability for police vehicles to remain anonymous to the criminal element being investigated. The St. Petersburg Police Department only uses JAG grant funds for rental vehicles that are in line with the JAG definition of a "patrol cruiser" which is defined as a vehicle used in the ordinary course by police forces in the United States for Law Enforcement activities such as patrolling, conducting surveillance and transporting individual prisoners.</p> <p>The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) will be utilizing funds to purchase Raptor Technologies Reunification software that includes unlimited licenses for members of the Pinellas County Reunification Task Force, authorized to use the software in support of reunification events involving Pinellas County private schools and Training and Technical Support. This task force will be comprised of 100 law enforcement personnel, both civilian and certified. Training will include software training, tabletop, and scenario-based exercises.</p>								
<p>Raptor Technologies is modifying its Reunification Software - which was developed primarily for schools as a tool to reduce the time and effort to reunify students and parents during a critical/catastrophic event - to accommodate a request from PCSO to include the ability to reunify a victim of any event; to capture identifiable information from a victim or someone</p>
