The Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners will conduct a public hearing on proposed amendments to the FY2024 Budget as required by Section 129.06 (2), Florida Statutes, relating to the appropriation of unanticipated revenue as specified herein.

A public hearing on the Resolution with virtual public participation and an on-site participation option, to be held on **Tuesday, November 19th at 6:00 p.m.**, or thereafter, in the Palm Room, 333 Chestnut Street, Clearwater, Florida 33756, with virtual participation utilizing Communications Media Technology (CMT) on the Zoom platform.

Members of the public wishing to address the body may attend in person, attend virtually, or provide comments in advance.

To address the County Commission in person, members of the public are encouraged to preregister at Pinellas.gov/comment. Preregistration is encouraged but not required if individuals plan to attend the meeting at the Assembly Room. Those who have not preregistered may register when they arrive.

Members of the public wishing to address the body virtually via Zoom or by phone are required to preregister by 5:00 P.M. the day before the meeting by visiting Pinellas.gov/comment. Certain matters heard by the Board of County Commissioners are quasi-judicial in nature. Please note that only competent, substantial, fact-based testimony or evidence may be considered by the boards in deciding the matters before them. Pure speculation or opinion, not based on competent facts, cannot be legally considered by the boards. Lay testimony with fact-based support (including but not limited to meeting minutes, surveys, engineering reports, etc.) may be considered competent and substantial evidence. Please note County Attorney's Office represents and advises the boards and county staff but cannot give legal advice to the applicant or other interested parties.

Appeals of any quasi-judicial final decision must be filed within 30 calendar days of the decision. Persons are advised that, if they decide to appeal any decision made at this meeting/hearing, they will need a record of the proceedings, and, for such purpose, they may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony, and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

Persons who are deaf or hard of hearing may provide public input on any agenda item through use of the State of Florida's relay service at 7-1-1.

The Resolution supplements the Solid Waste Revenue and Operating Fund by recognizing \$3,642,200 in unanticipated revenue from interest and increasing expenditures by \$3,642,200 due to a billing error with the City of Pinellas Park.

The Resolution supplements the Water Revenue and Operating Fund by recognizing \$50,000 in unanticipated revenue from a transfer from the Water Impact Fees Fund and increases reserves by \$50,000 to balance the fund.

The Resolution supplements the Water Impact Fees Fund by recognizing \$50,000 in unanticipated revenue from interest and increases transfer to the Water Revenue and Operating Fund by \$50,000 to transfer all available funding to that fund. This action will close out the Water Impact Fees Fund, which will no longer be utilized by Pinellas County Utilities' budget moving forward.

The total fiscal impact to the Solid Waste Revenue and Operating Fund is a \$3,642,200 increase to revenue and expenditures. The total fiscal impact to the Water Revenue and Operating Fund is a \$50,000 increase to revenue and expenditures. The total fiscal impact to the Water Impact Fees Fund is a \$50,000 increase to revenue and expenditures.

Additionally, the General Fund will realign \$27,003,300 from reserves to various operating expenses due to Hurricane Helene related expenses. The General Fund also realigns \$20,000 within the Public Defender's budget to provide funding in the necessary account lines for IT related purchases. There is no impact to the General Fund's bottom line as these actions are realignments of expenditures only.

In review of the Resolution above, there may be modifications that arise at the public hearing and/or with other responsible parties.
