Description & Comments

This Agreement with Ring Power Corporation is for preventive maintenance, repair, and replacement to include installation services as needed for electrical engineering testing services for all Pinellas County Utilities switchgear, automatic transfer switch (ATS), switchboard, and low voltage power circuit breakers maintenance, testing and calibration throughout Pinellas County.

The term is thirty-six (36) months, with contractor compensation not to exceed the sum of \$1,359,129.00. The estimated annual average expense is \$453,043.00. Twelve (12) months after the date of award and annually for the life of the contract, unit prices are adjustable (increase/decrease) in an amount not to exceed the average of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) or 5% whichever is less.

Per item 3 on page 4 of the Agreement, "The documents comprising this Agreement, which shall be known as the "Contract Documents", include the entirety of County's ITB pursuant to which this Agreement is awarded, including any addenda, and Contractor's submittal thereto..."

Addendum No. 2 to the Invitation to Bid allows for three (3) twelve (12) month extensions.

This expenditure is consistent with the FY23 Amended Utilities Budget in the Water and Sewer Revenue and Operating Funds.
