### Description & Comments

Housing and Community Development is seeking adoption a resolution approving a Substantial Amendment to the 2025/2026 Annual Action Plan for the purpose of receiving a second allocation of Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Rapid Unsheltered Survivor Housing (RUSH) funds and authorize submittal to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Substantial Amendment to the 2025/2026 Action Plan contains the application for a second allocation of ESG-RUSH funds. The County will receive \$1,608,589.00 in a second allocation of ESG-RUSH funds to be used to address the needs of homeless individuals or families at risk of homelessness in areas affected by hurricanes Helene and Milton.

Eligible ESG-RUSH activities include:

- Emergency shelter (congregate and non-congregate)
- Rapid re-housing or homelessness prevention
- Short/medium-term rental assistance
- Housing relocation and stabilization services
- Financial assistance for move-in costs
- Supportive services for people currently experiencing homelessness
- Street outreach services
- Homeless Management Information System Administration

The County will use 7.5% of the ESG-RUSH allocation for planning and administration costs. The Substantial Amendment to the 2025/2026 Action Plan allows the County to receive a second allocation of ESG-RUSH funds and identifies the types of activities the County will undertake to address the needs of the homeless and at-risk affected by the storms.

Funding for this agreement is included in the FY27 Budget for the Housing and Community Development Department in the Community Development Grant Fund and is contingent on adoption of the budget.
