**Description & Comments**

This is a subgrant agreement between the County and the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) for reimbursement of eligible costs incurred during the response to Hurricane Eta in November 2020.

When awarded, this grant will benefit the County by reimbursing certain eligible funds which were expended from the emergency reserves due to the hurricane and the Countywide state of emergency associated with it.

This grant will be multi-year and multi-departmental, which will likely have a minor impact on FY 24. OMB has already coordinated with Emergency Management, Utilities, and Public Works regarding costs for this grant.

This grant will be administered by the Office of Management and Budget in close coordination with Emergency Management, Utilities, Building & Development Review Services and Public Works.

The total reimbursable amount expended for emergency work is \$19,993.35, of which 100% - should all funds be considered eligible under the Public Assistance program - will be reimbursed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) via a passthrough grant managed by FDEM at the state level. There are no other funding sources associated with this project.

These expenses were partially budgeted for in FY 21 and would not likely require a future budget amendment. It is important to note that the agreement document indicates a lower amount of identified expenditures, but that the amount is subject to change and the submission for reimbursement will be the higher amount listed in this staff report

Based on established thresholds this grant application will require Board of County Commissioners approval.
