Comments:

Approval of the Agreements with Directions for Mental Health, Inc. dba Directions for Living (Directions), Operation Par, Inc., (PAR), and Westcare Gulfcoast-Florida, Inc., (Westcare) for the Cooperative Agreement to Benefit Homeless Individuals (CABHI). CABHI provides evidence-based mental health and substance use treatment to individuals that have been recently housed, and have a serious mental illness, emotional disturbance, substance use, or co-occurring diagnosis. The Agreements total an annual not to exceed amount of \$700,290.00 for Fiscal Year 2021 (FY21), effective from October 1, 2020 - September 30, 2023. CABHI began in FY17 as a federal grant, FY21 will be the first year the program is fully funded by the County. Reviewed Staff Report and Agreements. Prior agreement with CABHI reviewed and Historical Risk Review attached. Limits kept the same. Risk is moderate and limits reflect this.

Notes: These three (3) Agreements provide funding for CABHI. Under CABHI, Directions, PAR, and Westcare will continue providing collaborative behavioral health and substance use services to recently housed individuals and families at risk of homelessness. CABHI services include in-home counseling and peer support. Since FY17, CABHI has enrolled 270 clients through March of 2020 with 110 clients currently active. CABHI partner collaboration has been key in CABHI success, the team holds weekly meetings to staff new clients and problem solve encountered barriers.

In August of 2016, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) awarded the County a grant to implement the CABHI program. Fiscal Year 2020 (FY20) has been a transition from grant to county funding.

CABHI provides mental health and substance use treatment to individuals that are at risk of homelessness, have been

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recently housed, and have a serious mental illness, emotional disturbance, substance use, and/or co-occurring diagnosis. CABHI staff utilize engagement strategies to build relationships with clients and provide collaborative services to help clients maintain housing.

Fiscal Impact:

Funding in the amount not to exceed \$700,290.00 has been included in the proposed FY21 Human Services budget. Total FY21 contract amount for approval is an amount not to exceed \$700,290.00, effective October 1, 2020 - September 30, 2021.
